Discover Your City | Get Fit: Deuce CrossFit Gym




Professor Harry Lewis visits HCSC

On Tuesday, May 3, Gordon McKay Professor of Computer Science and for mer Dean of Harvard College Harry R. Lewis spoke to Harvard Club members at the USC University Club. He presented a revealing biographical snapshot of Gordon McKay, the engineer who made his fortune inventing and then leasing a machine for manufacturing shoes. Mr. McKay left money to Harvard University to endow engineering professorships and laboratories. Professor Lewis also pre sented future plans for the John A. Paulson School of Engineering and Applied Sciences on the Allston campus, and surveyed engineering research projects under way at Harvard.







Q&A from 02138... Zena Edosomwan '17

Zena Edosomwan '17, a concentrator in East Asian Studies, was born in Houston, Texas and graduated from Harvard W estlake High School, where he helped the basketball team win division championships in 2009 and 2011 and was team captain as a junior and senior . He was rated as the No. 76 prospect in the Class of 2013.

During his time at Harvard he started a project with his roommate Cyrus Motanya '17 and other Harvard students called The #BlackIs Project that turned into a movement across campus and spread to a few other schools across U.S. The

project tried to dispel stereotypes and give people individuality to write their own story before others had preconceived notions about them. The project was featured in the *Boston Globe*.

Edosomwan also created a summer camp with the W orld Leadership Schools Association (WLSA) school group that will be holding an academic camp in Shanghai with 150 students from across the globe who want to go college in the United States. He is currently a member of the Harvard Black Men's Forum and also plays on the Varsity Men's Basketball team, where this past year he was one of the co-winners of the Raymond P. Lavietes '36 Most Valuable Player Award. He led the team in both scoring and rebounding, narrowly miss - ing out on a double-double by posting averages of 13.1 points and 9.9 rebounds on the season. He ranked third among regulars by shooting just over 50 percent from the floor as the team's primary offensive option.

Last summer, Edosomwan went to China with the WLSA program for three weeks, spending time in

Xi'an, Shanghai, and Beijing teaching and giving presentations both in English and Mandarin about American college, along with coaching Chinese and Japanese students at these schools.

HCSC: What surprised you about being a student at Harvard?

ZE: Everyone at Harvard is very down to earth. Initially, I was worried that Harvard might be a pretentious and elitist place. So far, that has not been the case and I have truly enjoyed my experience.

HCSC: When was the first time you visited Harvard and what were your impressions at that time?

ZE: I first visited Harvard the fall of my senior year and immediately fell in love with the campus. I loved the rich history reflected in Harvard's buildings and the nostalgia of being on the country's oldest campus.

HCSC: What was your favorite class (or professor) and why?

ZE: My favorite professor has been Dr. Henry Louis "Skip" Gates. He was extremely charismatic, charming, and humble. I remember watching all his videos and learning about him in high school and now coming to Harvard and sitting in his office, simply fascinated by his vast knowledge and work. I've learned from Professor Gates to make the most of your days and to control your mood. Whenever I see him, he is always up-beat, hum ble, joking and laughing. He is constantly connecting himself with his students simply by talking to them after class and engaging with them on a personal level. He makes you feel comfortable and not intimidated, especially for someone who has achieved a lot of success. Who knows what he may be going through personally but he doesn't let that affect how he treats others.

HCSC: What has been your funniest moment at Harvard?

ZE: My funniest moment has been seeing my Head Coach, Tommy Amaker, do the popular "dab" dance after a great team victory.

HCSC: If you were president of Harvard, what would you change?

ZE: I truly wouldn't change anything if I were President at Harvard. I would just try and make sure we continue to grow as an institution that smoothly adapts and responds in a swift manner to the ever-changing world.

HCSC: What do you miss most about Southern California?

ZE: I miss my family especially my two 10-year -old siblings, Ola and Lola. It's hard being away from them especially as they grow up so quickly.

HCSC: What do you plan to do after graduating?

ZE: I plan on returning to southern California to live and raise a family here. I love southern California. It's a melting pot full of diversity. It has great food, weather, beaches, and amazing people. The only bad thing is the 405 freeway, especially in the morning.

HCSC: What are your summer plans?


ZE: This summer I plan on going to China to teach, coordinate, and moderate a summer camp/conference. I
