Six California Candidates Stand for HAA Overseer, Elected Director Posts

The Harvard Club Board of Directors has endorsed three candidates for the position of Overseer (six year term) and three candidates for Elected Director (three year term) of the Harvard Alumni Association. All of the endorsed candidates are residents of California, the highest number ever nominated and further testament to the growing importance of California alumni to Harvard.

All Harvard degree holders are encouraged to vote in the HAA's spring elections, which determine the composition of two of Harvard's important governing and alumni engagement groups. Ballots will be mailed by April 1 and must be received back in Cambridge by noon on May 18. The election results are announced at the HAA's annual meeting on the afternoon of Commencement, on May 24.


