# President's Message: Get Involved in Wintersession

Wintersession is the three-week period in January between the holidays and the start of the spring semester at Harvard. Students can spend the break on campus, travel, or stay home with their families. Some take advantage of the time to explore career interests by participating in internships or other programs.

For the first time this year, the Harvard Club of Southern California has organized a Finance Forum for undergraduates during Wintersession. The program will consist of a week-long schedule of meetings and tours with finance professionals, many of whom are Harvard alumni. Undergraduates may apply to participate through the College's Office of Career Services.

In addition, undergraduates interested in forming their own companies will have the opportunity to network with current entrepreneurs and representatives from various start-up companies at an event in Orange County. In the future, this program will also be expanded to a week of sessions geared to entrepreneurial-minded undergraduates.



# Science Pub Series #7 - Beyond Hubble A New Space Telescope to Explore the Cosmos

Learn about galaxy formation and the quest to explore new worlds, as explained by one of the main proponents of the successor to the Hubble Telescope, Alan Dressler, astronomer at the Carnegie Institute for Science in Washington, D.C.

The Hubble Space Telescope has revolutionized our understanding of stars, galaxies, and the nature of our vast universe, and blazed a trail to new journeys that lie beyond Hubble's reach. Alan Dressler will describe the James Webb Space Telescope, under final testing in preparation of its 2018 launch. This 'virtual spaceship' will carry us to the end of our journey to understand the birth of stars and galaxies at the dawn of the modern universe, and launch our new quest to locate other worlds like Earth that may be habitable, or even inhabited.

Alan Dressler is an astronomer at the Observatories of the Carnegie Institution. His research has focused on galaxy evolution, particularly the study of what leads to the diversity of different galaxy types and properties. He has used large ground-based telescopes such as Magellan, and space telescopes such as Hubble and Spitzer to look back in time to study the formation and evolution of galaxies. He was the chair of the committee that first proposed the James Webb telescope as a successor for the Hubble.

### Q&A from 02138... Nicole C. Hirschhorn '16

**Nicole C. Hirschhorn '16,** a concentrator in Psychology with a secondary in English, was born in Pacific Palisades, California, and graduated from Harvard-Westlake High School where she was captain of her junior varisty soccer team, acted in the Playwrights festival, played multiple roles in The Laramie Project, and first became involved in improv comedy. Two summers ago she was an intern at the Tonight Show starring Jimmy Fallon, and this past summer she was Marilu Henner's personal assistant and co-host of her nationally syndicated radio show, The Marilu Henner Show. She is a senior residing in Ouincy House. Her father is

Charles Hirschhorn '79 and her brother is Jason Hirschhorn '14-'15. Her brother Adam was recently accepted and intends to matriculate.

At Harvard, she is running IGP, along with Aaron Henricks '16, which is Harvard's oldest long-form improv comedy group; is a writer and actor for a yearly sketch comedy showcase; and is the founder/president of Harvard's only live sketch comedy group, Mess Hall. She reports the following fun fact: "I am very lactose intolerant, and have been for many years, but refuse to let that define me or my lifestyle."

### HCSC: What was your biggest surpise about Harvard?

**NH:** I knew that I would meet some of the most talented people that the world has to offer, but I never anticipated the passion or the variety of passions that I've encountered. The energy on campus is extremely contagious, and I'm more empathetic to others and inspired to follow my own dreams for being surrounded by it all.

### HCSC: What was your first visit and impressions?

**NH:** I first visited Harvard for my dad's 25th reunion the summer of 2004. I stayed in one of the dorms with my brothers and all I remember is being really hot and the one fan we had didn't work.

### HCSC: What has been your favorite class?

**NH:** By far, the most incredible class I've taken at Harvard is Professor Phyllis Thompson's class on 21st Century Feminism. It's amazing. She is amazing. Everyone in that class is amazing. I have grown up in the era of 3rd Wave Choice and Facebook Feminism, but was never aware of what lay behind this or the academic or historical side of things. There is so much to know and so much that needs to be done. This class has allowed me to consider what I had taken for granted and see what I had been blind to. I'm trying to figure out how to get people to listen to these issues and writing sketches based on the themes we've been discussing.

#### HCSC: What has been your funniest moment at Harvard?

**NH:** Improvising with (mostly watching) Keegan Michael Key, a comedian on Comedy Central, during IGP's Player of The Year show. I was so star-struck that I only remember some of it. It really was a dream.

### HCSC: If you were president of Harvard, what would you change?

**NH:** I would hold office hours. Is that unreasonable? I guess I would have to check Drew Faust's schedule. I assume she's pretty busy.

### HCSC: Describe a funny experience interning on the Tonight Show.

**NH:** The best day I had on the Tonight Show was when I sat in for Kelly Ripa during rehearsals for a game called "Pop Quiz." The premise involved me sitting in a hair salon chair that would continuously be raised higher and higher with every question I got wrong during a game of trivia. I was wearing a sharp pointed hat that would eventually break a 3-gallon water ballon over my head. I had to do this three times before they got the logistics right. It was all worth it when Jimmy gave me a pity-pat on the back.

### HCSC: What do you miss most about Southern California?

**NH:** The weather conditions in Boston is a small one, especially for a girl with thin blood. I miss being able to go to the beach, hike, ride my bike, and eat outside year round. And I miss my mom's garden.

### HCSC: How will Southern California factor into your future?

**NH:** I plan on returning to LA after graduation and doing something during the days while writing at night and taking classes at Upright Citizens Brigade. I worked as Marilu Henner's personal assistant last summer so I may return to that or go PA on a food network show in France for a year... I really have no clue. The end goal is to be a writer and performer, but it may take a while to get there.
