### Record Numbers of Southern Californians Chose to Attend Harvard

The Club's Schools and Scholarships Committee completed a banner year in 2010-2011, with 105 students from Southern California deciding to attend Harvard College, a record. Of the 2,556 applicants to Harvard from our region, 141 were admitted. Our region's yield was the highest level it has been in nearly 20 years, according to Marsha Hirano-Nakanishi, the Club's Executive Vice President and Co-Chair of the Schools Committee.

The large number of applicants from our region and nationally is attributed in part to Harvard's generous financial aid initiative, which has expanded in recent years. Since 2007 the financial aid budget has increased by more than 70% to a record \$166 million. Families with normal assets and income up to \$65,000 will not be required to pay any tuition. Previously, only families with assets and income up to \$60,000 were not required to pay tuition. "It really is about excellence," said Dean William Fitzsimmons in a recent interview. "You want to get the financial aid assistance to the people who need it most."

"We extend our sincere thanks to our army of more than 1,000 Schools Committee members who endeavored to complete the extraordinary task of interviewing our applicants," said Jonathan Baskin, Schools Committee Chair. "We especially thank our heroic Area Chairs who took on the responsibility of organizing the mammoth interviewing effort, assigning the interviews and doing many themselves: West Los Angeles - Hannah Zackson; Central Los Angeles - Ron Cuccia; San Fernando Valley- Mark Goldstein; South Bay -Karen Mayfield; San Gabriel Valley - Claudia Palos (once again assisting her husband Miguel, who is serving in the US armed forces in Helmand Province, Afghanistan); Riverside/San Bernardino Counties - Susan St. Louis; North Orange County - Anne Sinek and Aaron Wilson; and South Orange County - Richard Cowan and Patty Le-Narula."

### Jonathan Baskin, Long-Time Club Schools Committee Chair, To Step Down in June 2012

Jonathan Baskin AB '61, who has served as the Club's Schools and Scholarships Committee Chair for the past 17 years, will step down in June 2012, the Harvard College Admissions Office announced.

Under Baskin's leadership, the Harvard Club of Southern California has experienced soaring growth both in the numbers of applicants and admitted students to Harvard College from our region and in the numbers of alumni who assemble to interview them (see related story, page 1).

Baskin received the Hiram S. Hunn Memorial Schools and Scholarships Award in October 2008, Harvard's highest honor for valor and distinction in Schools and Scholarships work.

"It gives me pleasure to know that Harvard, among its peer institutions, is alone in endeavoring to give a personal interview to every applicant to the College," Baskin said. "In doing so we help local applicants gain access to the College, impact the character of each class, and convey to the public that Harvard is an institution open to qualified applicants from all walks of life and from any background. Everyone gets full consideration."

Baskin is an Emeritus Professor of Biological Sciences at California State Polytechnic University Pomona. Baskin is the Club's Vice President who chairs the committeee responsible for recruiting and interviewing applicants to the College. He oversees a team of over 1,000 alumni interviewers who work under the direct supervision of eight Area Chairs assigned to separate geographic areas of Southern California.

Daniel A. Medina AB '79, MBA '83, the current Harvard Club President, will become the Club's Schools and Scholarships Chair upon the completion of his term as Club President. Medina is an Analyst at Needham Company, LLC, a New York based investment bank. Prior to joining Needham & Company, LLC, Medina was Managing Director of Capital Knowledge, LLC, a financial services advisory firm. Baskin and Medina will work together this year to assure a smooth transition.

A few words from Dean Bill Fitzsimmons, Marlyn McGrath, Director of Admissions and Sally Donahue, Director of Financial Aid, in honor of Jonathan Baskin:

"As the admissions season for the Class of 2016 opens, we pay special tribute to Jonathan Baskin, our 31-year-interviewer and 17-year-Southern California Schools and Scholarships Committeee Chair, who will hand over the reins this spring to Dan Medina. A tireless volunteer and Harvard ambassador, Jonathan has recruited decades of talented students and interviewers during a particularly transformative time not just in LA, but as his co-chair Marsha Hirano-Nakanishi describes, "stretching across Death Valley and Palm Springs to the Nevada border and up along the spine of highway from the San Fernando Valley through Lone Pine up to Mammoth." We are thankful for Jonathan's distinguished service and take our hats off to his masterful work. He is, without doubt, one of our most outstanding Schools and Scholarships leaders in Harvard's long history."


