

# Interview with Alumni Interviewer... Marsha Hirano-Nakanishi, Stanford '71, Harvard Ed.D '81

Each admissions season, alumni interviewers, under the leadership of our Club's Schools Committees, help the Admissions Office evaluate applicants to Harvard College. The Schools Committee is the Club's largest volunteering activity. Each year, over 700 graduates of Harvard College and graduate schools interview over 2,700 candidates from our region.

In the process, alumni participate in college fairs throughout the area and give presentations on Harvard, initiating and maintaining relationships with parents, guidance counselors, other alumni/ae, and the general public. Executive Vice President Marsha Hirano-Nakanishi EdD '81 coordinates the Schools Committee's work with the area chairs who divide up the interview assignments among alumni and manage the operations for their geographic area. The newsletter will feature profiles of the area chairs.

Marsha Hirano-Nakanishi, Stanford '71, Harvard Ed.D '81, is executive vice president of the Club, serving this year as the interim vice president for Schools and Scholarship Committee, coordinating the Schools Committee's work with area chairs who are responsible for the interview assignments among alumni for their geographic area.

Marsha completed her doctoral coursework at Harvard and returned to Los Angeles in the mid-70s. She worked on projects relating to the landmark California Supreme Court case, Serrano v Priest, in the 1970s involving California's method of funding public eduction to meet the requirement of the equal protection guarantee of the Constitution so all students receive the same educational opportunities regardless of the wealth of the taxpayers in their district. She was a court monitor involving another schools case. She coordinated a National Institute of Education research project for school improvement. She joined the Harvard Schools Committee, and started interviewing when Burt Levitch '76, former Club president was chair of Central Los Angeles Schools Committee. She was one of the first all-university interviewers, having attended Harvard as a graduate student. She subsequently chaired the Central Los Angeles Committee until 2000, when she moved to co-chair the Schools Committee with Jonathan Baskin '61 and turned the Central Los Angeles Committee over to Daniel Medina AB '79, MBA '83, an Angeleno from Loyola High School, who will resume his position as Schools Committee vice president next year.


"At first interviewing applicants from Garfield, Bell Gardens, Roosevelt, and my alma mater Wilson was a respite from the near-despair that work in educational reform can engender. Applicants' achievements, talents, curiosity and stories brighten anyone's day," Marsha said.

"Over the years, it has been gratifying to see the number of Southern Californian admits to Harvard College increase as well as become more diverse. When I was offered admission to the Radcliffe Class of 1971, there were just three of us, two from Marlborough School and me from East Los Angeles," she noted. "Today there are thirty-fold more female admits to Harvard." [Editor's Note: Marsha chose Stanford over Radcliffe for college. She recalls that at the time her parents knew no one east of Chicago, plus Stanford had the Stanford Linear Accelerator and she wanted to be a physicist].

"I once read somewhere that the Harvard admission mission was to select a class of about 1,500 American men to lead the world in all walks of life," she added, "The leadership goal remains the same, but the geography extends well beyond the northeast to the whole world, and the last two Harvard Presidents have been clear that they expect prospective leaders to emerge from low- and middle-income circumstances."

# Q&A from 02138... Ji Su Yoo '15

(These interviews are a regular contribution to the HCSC Newsletter and will spotlight students enrolled at Harvard who are from Southern California. Nominations to profile students from our region are invited.)

**Ji Su Yoo '15** was born in Sao Paulo, Brazil, but she grew up in the Los Angeles area and graduated from Glendale High School. At Harvard, she is a Social Studies concentrator in Quincy House, and she lives in the newly renovated Stone Hall. Since Cambridge is such a running city, she has come to grow fond of jogging by the Charles River.

This past summer, Ji Su was in Seoul, South Korea conducting thesis research about inter-Korean reunification and international peace negotiation. Many of the courses she has taken analyze international relations between East Asian countries. However, she tries to take advantage of all the course offerings at Harvard outside her concentration. For example, she really enjoyed taking an introductory electrical engineering course. Outside of the classroom, she enjoys singing and leading Harvard's "Under Construction" a capella group as the musical and concert director. With Under Construction, she has toured in New Orleans and Taiwan, and this upcoming year, she will be in Haiti. Additionally, she goes on retreats to New Hampshire and Vermont with her friends in Harvard College Faith and Action, an on-campus Christian fellowship.

#### HCSC: What surprised you about being a student at Harvard?

**JSY:** I was surprised that people don't often discuss academics over meals and in casual conversation. When I saw the Harvard recruitment materials and handbooks, it always seemed like Harvard students would have deep intellectual discussions about the meaning of life, but that was not the case.

#### HCSC: When was the first time you visited Harvard and what were your impressions at that time?

**JSY:** I came to Harvard for the first time when I came for my Visitas weekend. It rained all weekend, but I was able to chat with encouraging upperclassmen who I ended up becoming good friends with.

#### HCSC: What do you miss most/least about not being in Cambridge?

**JSY:** I miss my friends and the Christian community that I have found at Harvard. I also occasionally miss the endless supply of Diet Coke and coffee during brain break.

#### HCSC: What was your favorite class (or professor) and why?

**JSY:** One of my favorites courses was Sociology 190: Life and Death in the U.S.: Medicine and Disease in Social Context with Nicholas Christakis. I learned that I am truly interested in public health through this course. My favorite professor thus far, however, is Professor Carter Eckert. He is genuinely invested in his students – he comes to section and participates in our discussion even though he is a big-shot professor in Korean History.

#### HCSC: How do you think Southern California will figure into your future after Harvard?

**JSY:** I hope to go back to work in the Los Angeles area to be with my family as I prepare for graduate school.

#### HCSC: If you were President of Harvard, what would change?

**JSY:** I would try to give every student a time turner (like Hermione Granger's) so that they could have all the time to do what they love: study, join extracurricular groups, relax with friends, and give back to their community. I love how students are involved in so many diverse extracurriculars, but I would want my students get more sleep and get less coffee while they're at it.

# HCSC: How does your Harvard experience compare with your fellow high school classmates' experiences at other colleges?


**JSY:** Many of my friends went to universities in California. When I visit their campuses, I can already feel that the culture is more relaxed. Plus, they all have cars so they have more mobility to explore the surrounding areas. I experienced culture shock coming to Cambridge because people like to schedule in lunches (everyone is so busy.) But now, as a senior, I am less comfortable with spontaneity when I visit my friends in other campuses. Additionally, I think other schools express more spirit - we have less of that culture except for the Harvard-Yale game.

#### HCSC: What do you miss most about Southern California?

**JSY:** I love my friends in Cambridge but I still think So Cal is the best place to live. Hands down. I miss the perfect sunny weather. I miss the laid-back culture that has space for spontaneous get-togethers and coffee chats. Hopefully many of my friends will come here so that I can have the best of both worlds.


