Record Number Apply from Southern California

JUNE 2013

Southern California applications to Harvard College rose to another record high. 2,713 candidates from our region applied for the Class of 2017, with 140 accepted, a 5.2% acceptance rate. However, both the number of accepted students and the acceptance rate fell below last year's numbers of 148 accepted students and a 5.7% acceptance rate.

Daniel A. Medina AB '79, MBA '83, the Club's Schools and Scholarships Chair, emphasized the importance of the alumni interview in the admissions process and the hard work of all the alumni interviewers to meet, interview, and provide Cambridge with write-ups that are integral to the admissions process. The Harvard Club has over 800 active alumni interviewers and is always looking to add to its roster.

Nationally, Harvard College experienced a 2% increase in applicants, to 35,023, and accepted 2,029 students for the Class of 2017, representing 5.8 percent of the applicant pool of 35,023. Nearly 60% of students accepted this year will benefit from financial aid, with students and their families paying an average of \$12,000 per year. Harvard's financial aid budget for next year will be \$182 million, a record, and an increase over last year's \$172 million budget.

Decisions were due in Cambridge on May 1st and early indications are that 99 students accepted Harvard's offer of admission, a 71% yield. The 71% yield from Southern California was below Harvard's overall yield of 82%, the highest yield since the Class of 1973, according to Medina.

John Harvard Award: Lucy Fisher, Producer, Red Wagon Entertainment

Lucy Fisher, former Vice Chairman of the Columbia Tri-Star Motion Picture Group at Sony Pictures, is an award-winning motion picture producer and Co-head of Red Wagon Entertainment. Fisher and Red Wagon's most recent production "The Great Gatsby" stars Leonardo DiCaprio and Tobey Maguire. Q&A from 02138... Anne McGrath '13



(These interviews are a regular contribution to the HCSC Newsletter and will spotlight students enrolled at Harvard who are from Southern California)

Anne McGrath '13 was born in Los Angeles. She graduated from Harvard-Westlake in North Hollywood where she did photography and stage managed theatrical productions for the drama department. In her senior year, she won the drama department award for her work as a stage manager and as the student producer of the school's annual one-acts festival. McGrath is an English major and Lowell House resident. Her father, Thomas B. McGrath AB '76, MBA ' 80, a media executive and theatrical musical producer based in Los Angeles, was a resident of Eliot House, when he was music director of the Hasty Pudding Theatricals and conductor of both the Harvard University Band and the Harvard-Radcliffe Gilbert

and Sullivan Players.

Before matriculating to Harvard, McGrath took a year off (gap year) and pursued various professional opportunities in theater and television, including a semester-long internship at The Public Theater in New York and a job as a production assistant on The Suite Life on Deck, a Disney Channel show.

While at Harvard, McGrath has been extensively involved as a stage manager, producer, and costumer for many Harvard-Radcliffe Dramatics Club theatrical productions. She has also served on the board of the Harvard-Radcliffe Gilbert & Sullivan Players since the spring semester of her Freshman year.

This past summer, she produced an independent short film in Los Angeles, Slushamed, and a new original play at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe, The House of Shadows, that was written and directed by her blockmate, Joshua McTaggart '13, and starred Bryan Kauder '14, and Peter Bestoso '14. HCSC: What surprised you about being a student at Harvard?

AM: I think what's surprised me the most is the importance of what you do outside of the classroom. My time at Harvard has been defined not so much by my academic experience as everything that's happened around it -- primarily my extracurricular involvement in theater.

HCSC: When was the first time you visited Harvard and what were your impressions at that time?

AM: I first visited Harvard pretty early on in my life when my parents were attending their college reunions -- Dad's at Harvard and Mom's at Wellesley. At the time I was obsessed with the fact that Wellesley's campus had a swing set, and I told my younger sister, "You can go to Harvard, but I'm going to Wellesley." That statement has proven to only be half true, as my younger sister Sally will be starting Harvard next year as a member of the class of 2017.

HCSC: What was your favorite class (or professor) and why?

AM: One professor that I have really loved is Andrew Warren. He was new to the English department when I was a sophomore, and I've taken three courses with him during my Harvard career. He is the single professor who has done the most to get me excited and engaged with academics at Harvard. He has a great way of being incredibly intelligent and knowledgeable about the material while maintaining an incredible enthusiasm and being a really generous discussion leader.

HCSC: What has been your funniest moment at Harvard?

AM: On the night before housing day this year, traditionally "River Run" for the freshmen, some other senior friends and I invented "Reverse River Run" aka "Yard Run." Instead of visiting all of the upperclass houses we stopped in every freshman dorm, and even visited some rooms that had been important to us during our first year here (waking up a few confused freshmen along the way).

HCSC: If you were President of Harvard, what would change?

AM: I think a lot of students are frustrated with the lack of transparency and communication from the administration, especially when uncomfortable or tragic situations arise and the students could really benefit from that institutional reassurance.

HCSC: How does your Harvard experience compare with your fellow high school classmates' experiences at other colleges?

AM: My close friends from high school had a variety of experiences. One of my closest friends went to the University of Southern California and joined a sorority, which gave her an extremely different type of social experience than I've had at Harvard, where my social life has been primarily dictated by and limited to my extracurriculars. On the other hand, another close friend attends Brown and has had an extremely similar experience to mine.

HCSC: What do you miss most about Southern California?

AM: I know it's cliche, but I really do miss the weather. Even more so than the cold in winter, I've been surprised by the constant humidity. I'm used to the desert, with dry heat and a drastic temperature decrease at night, but in Boston in summer it stays sticky and warm 24 hours a day.

Immediately after graduation, McGrath plans to travel for the summer and then move back to Los Angeles to begin her career in the fall. She grew up with parents in the entertainment industry, and her goal is also to find success in that area, eventually hoping to be in television production.


