Chasing History at the Harvard-Yale Game





After eight consecutive victories over Y ale, the Crimson seeks sole ownership of the all-time win streak when it faces of f against the Bulldogs on November 21, 2015. The contest is also notable for the fact it will feature football after dark at the Y ale Bowl for the first time in the rivalry's 140-year history.

The Game will be played at 2:30 P.M. East Coast time, a significant departure from the noontime kick-offs that have defined the rivalry for decades. As a result, Los Angeles telecast attendees will be able to sleep in a bit this year, with a local kick-of f time of 11:30 A.M.

With Harvard defeating Yale in 13 of the last 15 contests, the rivalry has seemingly been one sided in the new millennium. However, despite perfect seasons and multiple Ivy League championships by the Crimson during that span, The Game has often remained the most exciting contest of the year, with numerous fourth-quarter comebacks and even a triple overtime game defining a rivalry that, although lopsided in results, has always remained dramatic in contest.





Join the Harvard Club to hear two of the most beloved and accomplished artists of our time team up for an exquisite violin and piano recital.

Strauss was an accomplished pianist and violinist, and it shows in the idiomatic virtuosity of the Violin Sonata he composed in 1887, when he was 23. That was the year Strauss first met the soprano Pauline de Ahna, whom he would later marry, and it is not hard to hear suggestions of romantic ardor in the lush lyricism of the work. This is particularly true of the rapt, long-breathed Improvisation, the Andante cantabile middle movement, which proved so popular that Strauss allowed it to be published separately.

Club Officer Madeleine Mejia Selected as HAA Regional Director for the Pacific Southwest

Madeleine Mejia EdM '00 was recently chosen as the new Harvard Alumni Association Regional Director for the Pacific Southwest. In her new role, Madeleine will serve as the primary liaison among Clubs and SIGs in Los Angeles, Santa Barbara, San Diego, Hawaii and Maui. She will serve as an advocate and a source of guidance, mentorship and support, acting as a communications conduit to the HAA to build leadership capacity and organizational strength for this region. She intends

to concentrate her efforts on the HAA Board initiative for Student and Recent Graduate Engagement and will also serve in the Advancing Clubs and SIGs committee.

Madeleine has been an active member of the Harvard Club of Southern California since she joined in 2010, and was chair of the Annual Dinner committee in 2011 and 2012. After serving as a board director from 2010 to 2012, she became Vice President of Programs, a position she still holds.

When not working with the Club, Madeleine is Program Director of the Rossier School of Education at the University of Southern California, where she develops professional development programs for K-12 educators. She recently received her doctorate from USC in teacher education and is extending her research interests in the courses she teaches and the new credential programs she is developing. While at USC, she was also active as a Board Director for USC Phi Delta Kappa from 2008-2012 and received the Outstanding Service Award from them in 2013.

Madeleine said she "looks forward to supporting the HAA eforts and building a closer community between the Clubs and SIGs in my region." The nominaton was recommended to HAA by Cynthia A. Torres, AB '80, MBA 84', immediate past HAA president and former Club president, and Kenneth Williams, AB '78, past HAA Regional Director and former Club president. The HAA Regional Director is a three-year appointment.



Marsha Nakanishi Awarded Hiram Hunn Award from Harvard Admissions

Marsha Hirano-Nakanishi EdD '81 was awarded the Hiram S. Hunn Memorial Schools and Scholarships Award by the Harvard College Office of Admissions and Financial Aid at a ceremony in Cambridge on October 3, 2015 for her longtime work with candidates to Harvard College. Marsha, a Harvard Club of Southern California Board member and Co-Chair of the Schools and Scholarships Committee, was one of seven alumni to receive the Hunn award. Hiram Hunn was a member of the Class of 1921 and recruited and interviewed prospective students on behalf of the

College for many decades. Marlyn McGrath Lewis '70, Director of Admissions at Harvard College, noted that Marsha's "loyalty, dedication and longstanding ef fort on behalf of Harvard University have enabled scores of young men and women to enter Harvard Y and to begin their College experience." Lewis also acknowledged California's growth in enrollees at the College over the past several years and the important role of alumni interviews contributing to that growth. Other past Club recipients of this award are co-chair of the Schools and Scholarship Committee and former Club president Daniel Medina AB '79, MBA '83 in 2012, former Schools Committee chair Jonathan Baskin AB '61 in 2008, alumni interviewer area chair Miguel Palos AB '76 and his wife Claudia Palos in 2013, and Jody Cukier Siegler AB '79, MBA '81 in 2011.

Hirano-Nakanishi spoke about how much Harvard admissions has evolved since she was first of fered an acceptance to the Radcliffe Class of 1971 (she matriculated at Stanford) to its now global outreach. She noted that Harvard College provides ever-increasing financial aid, and cited the winter coat program and discreetly provided tickets to Harvard events as enabling students to acclimate and participate fully in Harvard life. Hirano-Nakanishi also applauded the thousands of alumni and alumnae volunteers who serve as trusted voices with their interview reports on applicants, but also as ambassadors of Harvard University, and mentoring First Generation students.


Create your January Winternship
