# Keep Calm and Carry On... Beating Yale!

On November 21, 2015, more than 100 Harvard and

Yale alumni gathered at Busy's East in Los Angeles to watch the Harvard football team defeat Yale 38-19 in the 132nd edition of the rivalry affectionately known as The Game.

Adding significance to the win was the resulting school record of three consecutive Ivy League championships for Crimson, as well as a record ninth consecutive victory over Yale, the longest streak by either school in their 140-year rivalry. Combined with an equally enjoyable time for the attendees at Busby's, it was a great day to be a SoCal fan of Harvard football.

Unlike some of the recent contests requiring lastminute heroics by the Crimson to keep their streak intact, Yale scored the first touchdown of the game only to see their lead last a mere 57 seconds, as Harvard began its run of 31 unanswered points. Yale's scoring drought continued until the fourth quarter, and by then the Harvard victory was all but settled.

For the Harvard attendees at Busby's East, the group was a diverse mix of young and old, with many first-time attendees and children joining this year's event. Run by the alumni sibling team of Franklin Barreno AB '95 and Wendy Barreno AB '95, MPP '12, the half-time raffle was one of the most enjoyable in years with several great moments and the introduction of the Harvard Rally Monkey, won appropriately by the youngest attendee at the event (five years old).

# Q&A from 02138... Alexander Jaffe '15



Alexander Jaffe '15, a concentrator in Organismic and Evolutionary Biology, was born in Santa Monica and graduated from Harvard-Westlake School where he played tennis and helped run a peer tutoring program. He also participated in biological research off-campus at UCLA during summers. He resided in Kirkland House.

At Harvard, he continued science research, helped run a student art show, and taught ceramics in Quincy House. He was also a staff photographer for the Harvard Crimson.

After graduation, he did a summer internship at a Bay Area biotech startup called Radiant Genomics. and this fall prepared applications for graduate school in the biological sciences before starting a research internship in Paris on a Harvard fellowship (Alex G. Booth Traveling Scholarship).

### HCSC: What surprised you about being a student at Harvard?

**AJ:** I know it's cliché, but the people you meet - at Harvard I've had the good fortune to spend time with many kind, genuine, and very interesting folks from around the world.

### HCSC: When was the first time you visited Harvard and what were your impressions at that time?

**AJ:** It must have been during my junior year of high school, on a college tour - I knew a current student at the time and so was lucky enough to see a few classes and dorms beyond the scope of the standard tour. I loved it.

### HCSC: What was your favorite class (or professor) and why?

**AJ:** It'd be hard to choose one in particular, but my freshman seminar is certainly up there. It was co-taught by two top professors from the Classics and Biology departments and examined representations of animals in Greco-Roman antiquity. Learning about such an interesting, niche topic from two highly respected educators was truly an amazing experience.

### HCSC: What do you miss most about Southern California (other than the weather)?

**AJ:** Weather for sure, especially given how brutal this past winter was, but I might say I miss the slower pace. Also Bay Cities Deli in Santa Monica.

### HCSC: How do you think Southern California will figure into your future after Harvard?

AJ: I definitely plan to return to SoCal for at least a few years after graduation, maybe longer depending on graduate school.
