Harvard Club Hosts Area Undergraduates and New Admits **During Winter Break**

The Harvard Club of Southern California hosted numerous events for Harvard undergraduates and alumni during the Harvard winter break, which lasted from December 20, 2014 through January 25, 2015.

On January 11, 2015, Dr. Miguel Palos '76, Harvard Club of Southern California Schools Committee area co-chair for San Gabriel Valley, and his wife Caludia Palos, hosted a reception for the newest admits to the Harvard Class of 2019 at their home in Pasadena. The Early Action admits from Southern California numbered a record high 63, of which approximately 50 students, along with their parents and their interviewers and area chairs, were welcomed. More than 350 students from the greater Southern California area applied for admission. Nationally, Harvard received 5,919 applications for Early Action, which was 26 percent more than last year. Harvard accepted 977 of those candidates (16.6 percent), the lowest rate for Early Action in many years. Regular Action applications are being evaluated in what is expected to be another record year.

On January 13th, Global Networking Night attracted over 250 students, alumni, and guests to the Viceroy Hotel in Santa Monica for an evening of networking and fun at the bi-annual event. A wide range of professional fields were represented, offering attendees the opportunity to mingle with fellow Harvardians who have chosen different professional paths. "It was an exciting and eclectic mix of people of all ages, cultures and careers," said Jordan Reddout Wilhoit AB '10, the event's organizer. The success of the event was yet another example of how vibrant the Harvard community is in Southern California - over 3,000 miles from Cambridge.

On January 6, 2015, for the third year in a row, Harvard undergraduates and alumni gathered at the Pacific Palisades home of HCSC board member Patric M. Verrone '81 and his wife, Maiya Williams Verrone '84. The Verrones hold the annual function to welcome the two dozen undergraduate participating in "Harvardwood 101." The two-week program, now in its 14th year, features an intensive schedule designed to introduce Harvard undergraduates interested in a career in show business to meet with and develop relationships with industry representatives, many of whom who are Harvard alumni. The event at the Verrone home (which, for the first time was co-sponsored by the Verrones' son, Patric C.W. Verrone '18) was a chance for the students to socialize with writers, directors, actors, musicians, agents, and executives in the industry. "It's our hope," said Verrone, "that, not only will the undergrads make connections that lead to employment and career advancement but, once the students have become successful, they can return the favor and employ the grizzled old veterans that gave them their start."

Later this year, the HCSC will be developing a similar program for the Southern California finance industry in the hopes of offering it in January, 2016. 



Q&A from 02138... Ye Dam Lee '15

(These interviews are a regular contribution to the HCSC Newsletter and will spotlight students enrolled at Harvard who are from Southern California. Nominations to profile students from our region are invited.)

Ye Dam Lee '15, a concentrator in mathematics, was born in Seoul, South Korea and graduated from the Loomis Chaffee School in Connecticut, where she was captain of the debate team and a resident assistant for underclassmen during her junior and senior years. She moved to Orange County in 2000, so she returns to Southern California for the holidays. During the summers, she went to various math camps like PROMYS and

Ross, where she discovered a love of math. She is a senior residing in Quincy House.

At Harvard, Ye has served as co-head usher of the Memorial Church since sophomore year and has been a member of Harvard College Faith and Action (HCFA) since freshman year. She was also co-president of CHANCE, an after-school program that tutors local students for the SAT, and has worked as a course assistant for math classes. Concurrently, she has been enrolled in the Undergraduate Teacher Education Program, and spent last spring student-teaching at the local public school. This past summer, Ye went to Botswana to intern as a teacher assistant; the year before, she went to Poland with WorldTeach and taught English at a small school in the countryside. The summer after freshman year, she went to Peru to learn Spanish and work at an orphanage in Lima.

HCSC: What surprised you about being a student at Harvard?

YDL: I knew it would be true, but I was still surprised to see for myself that the stereotype of the liberal New England intellectual Harvard student did not actually hold for most of the people I met--thank goodness! It's been really fun meeting people who have come here by vastly different paths than my own.

HCSC: When was the first time you visited Harvard and what were your impressions at that time?

YDL: I first visited Harvard when I was quite young and our family took a vacation. I remember only that we had lunch in the Square afterward. A harbinger, perhaps, of my college life...

HCSC: What was your favorite class (or professor) and why?

YDL: This past term, I took a US-World General Education class about transatlantic relations since the First World War, and it was, for me, a vindication of the General Education System. Previous history classes had always ended at or before the Second World War and learning about the Cold War was incredibly helpful not only to my understanding of my world, but also of the world in which my parents grew up.

HCSC: What has been your funniest moment at Harvard?

YDL: If under "funny" you include "odd," I think working as an usher at church has led to some pretty funny moments--it's a nontrivial task to try to preserve a reverent atmosphere in one of the few buildings on campus that is open to tourists, and every week, it's an exercise in tact. For example, it is very clearly posted, and we remind tourists, not to take photographs during worship. Often, they'll smile and nod and then discreetly (or not) take a photo anyway--holding their camera near their stomach, pretending they're using their phone for something else and snapping a photo when they think no one is looking. Then I feel absurd but I firmly place myself in front of their camera.

HCSC: What do you miss most about Southern California (other than the weather)?

YDL: I miss delicious, cheap, year-round fruit--especially pomegranates and avocados.

HCSC: If you were President of Harvard, what would change?

YDL: I think the Math Department--at least, its faculty--should be required to take workshops on how to support women and be a non-discriminating in the workplace. Being a part of the department has probably been the worst part of my Harvard experience; among other things, there we are given very few female role models (there has been exactly one female tenured research professor in the department's entire history), and I've taken three classes where I was the only woman in the room.

HCSC: How do you think Southern California will figure into your future after Harvard?

YDL: I am pretty sure I want to settle back here within a few years of my graduation--you really cannot beat the fruit.

HCSC: What are your plans after graduation?

YDL: Within a few years, I want to be teaching high school math somewhere in California, but I'm not quite sure what I'm doing next year. I might be taking some time to travel or to learn something completely different from math, something new.


