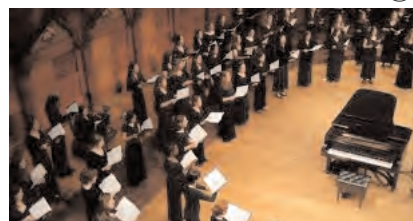

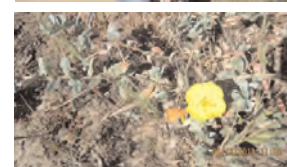


Beach Dunes Cleanup on March 19

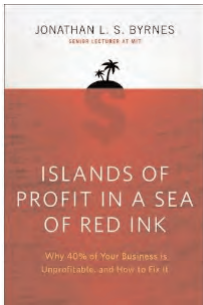

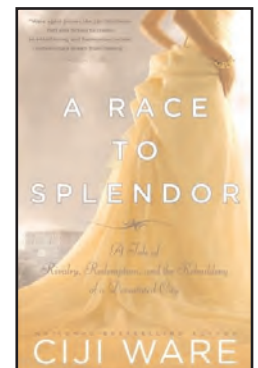
Book Talk and Afternoon Tea with Ciji Ware

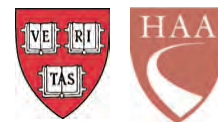
