Global Networking Night Attracts Record-Breaking Crowds in LA, Orange County

On March 19, the Harvard Club of Southern California hosted the annual Global Networking Night (GNN). Alumni connected through two vibrant events in Los Angeles and Newport Beach. Co-hosted by Harvardwood, Harvard Latino Alumni Alliance, Harvard Black Alumni Society of SoCal, Harvard Asian American Alumni Alliance, Harvard Alumni for Education, First-Generation Harvard Alumni, Harvard Business School Association of Southern California, Harvard Business School Association of Orange County, and the Harvard Alumni Association, this year's GNN welcomed over 400 attendees in Los Angeles and 150 in Orange County, making it an unparalleled celebration of community and connection.

Attendees enjoyed exchanging stories, sharing professional insights, and exploring opportunities to collaborate across industries.

Harvard Club Endorses Courtney Vance for Overseer, Nick Melvoin for HAA Director

In this spring's Harvard elections, The Harvard Club of Southern California's Board endorses Courtney B. Vance '82 for the Board of Overseers and Nick Melvoin '08 for Harvard Alumni Association Elected Director.

The Harvard Club Board encourages all alumni to vote. Harvard is unusual among US universities in that the members of one of its two governing boards are directly elected by the alumni. Courtney B. Vance: Candidate for Harvard Board of Overseers

Courtney Vance is a distinguished actor, director, and producer, and is an Emmy, Tony, and Critics' Choice award recipient with films including The Hunt for Red October and television shows such as The People v. O.J. Simpson: American Crime Story. He delivered the keynote address at Harvard Alumni Day last year. He and his wife, actress Angela Bassett, jointly received the 2025 Hasty Pudding's Order of the Golden Sphinx Award in recognition of their extraordinary contributions to the performing arts.

"Harvard is where I found myself," said Mr. Vance in a written statement to this newsletter. "I will always be eternally grateful for the space it afforded me to grow. Harvard's recent struggles are but a microcosm of what the United States has struggled with since its inception - bringing the ideal of freedom together with the reality of freedom. And just because we are going through challenging times, just because we don't completely agree on a way forward, doesn't mean that the baby goes out with the bathwater. It simply means we work harder at this grand experiment called a democracy, to bring it into the 'marvelous light.' Anything worth doing, is worth fighting for! And Harvard is worth fighting for."



Nicholas J. Melvoin: Candidate for HAA Director

Nick Melvoin is a civic leader, teacher, and attorney with a deep commitment to public service and education. Mr. Melvoin is his eighth year as an elected board member and past vice president of the Los Angeles Unified School District, the second-largest school district in the U.S. Prior to his election, he was an adjunct faculty member at Loyola Marymount's School of Education and served as a consultant to nonprofits. As a middle school English teacher in LA's Watt's neighborhood, he joined a lawsuit arguing that teacher layoffs violated students' civil rights. He is a member of a Harvard Kennedy School Board of Advisors and has lectured at both the Kennedy School and the Graduate School of Education. As a student, he was a Class Day speaker and an editor of The Harvard Crimson.

"I'm driven by the Jewish idea of *tikkun olam*, or repairing a broken world, and have dedicated my entire career since Harvard to public service," he said in a statement. "One of my guiding philosophies is that there is more that unites most people than divides them. My professional background has prepared me well to build consensus across lines of difference, including in the alumni community."



Harvard Men's Tennis Aces Southern California Tournament



The Harvard Men's Tennis team, led by Head Coach Andrew Rueb '95, stormed the courts in Southern California during their spring break in March, as the No. 10 team defeated other ranked opponents.

For the second year in a row, the squad has more SoCal graduates than from any other region: Kareem Ansari '25 (Pasadena, Polytechnic High School); Masato Perera '26 who is rated #18 in doubles (Santa Barbara, San Marcos High School); James MacDonald '27 (Santa Monica, University High School in Irvine); and Rohan Murali '27 (San Diego, Santana High School), and

team manager Andrew Arkow '27 (Los Angeles, Harvard-Westlake High School).

To kick off their annual West Coast trip, making the adjustment from the indoor season to the outdoor courts, the Crimson scored its eighth straight win in its opener on the road in a decisive 7-0 decision against San Diego State. Later in the week, the netmen fell to No. 7 San Diego, 5-2, in a competitive contest that went to the third and final sets of the singles contests. In its final match hours before boarding the Sunday red-eye to Logan, Harvard defeated No. 45 UC Irvine, 6-1, improving to 13-4 on the year.

The netmen begin conference play to defend their Ivy League title for the fourth-straight season starting against Dartmouth.

Q & A from 02138:

Edwin Dominguez '25



Edwin Dominguez '25, a concentrator in Mechanical Engineering, graduated from Ramona High School in Riverside, California where he ran multiple clubs, including the Physics Club. He was a section leader in the school's inaugural mariachi band, where they played all over the Southern California region to help jumpstart mariachi bands at other public schools. He was the sergeant-at-arms of the school's public service club.

Edwin is a senior residing in Mather House. At Harvard, he is the chassis lead for the Harvard Undergraduate Automotive Society, where he is working on designing and fabricating a chassis for a formula-styled car to compete in the FSAE competition. Edwin is a part of the Harvard Men's Varsity Soccer team as well, where he plays center back. He is an active member of Harvard College Christian Students. Last summer he worked at CalPortland Company in Oro Grande, California as a mechanical engineering intern, leading teams in their repairs around the plant while also creating computer-aided design drawings for industrial equipment.

HCSC: What surprised you about being a student at Harvard?

ED: What surprised me the most about being a student at Harvard was the amount of aid each course provides. I always thought that we would be on our own and never really get to know our professors on a personal level, but that was not the case. I actually felt like I got to know each professor and each course provided more than enough assistance to help each student do well.

HCSC: When was the first time you visited Harvard, and what were your impressions at that time?

ED: The first time I visited Harvard was actually during soccer pre-season during my freshman year in 2021. I was completely awe-struck by the whole campus, especially since all of the buildings were of older architecture, which is something we do not see in Southern California. I had also never seen pictures of Harvard, so it was all completely new to me, and I was excited to get started.

HCSC: What was your funniest moment at Harvard?

ED: My funniest moment at Harvard was definitely while working one of the on-campus grilles, specifically Quincy Grille. All of the students that came along to the grille in the late hours always had funny stories to tell. I always enjoyed talking to students, especially since these conversations allowed me to meet new people from all over campus.

HCSC: If you were President of Harvard, what would change?

ED: If I were President of Harvard, I would immediately make changes to the dining hall. Although the people are great and the food is sometimes good, it definitely needs a rehaul to provide more, healthy alternatives in addition to the already warm, home comfort foods.

HCSC: What do you miss most about Southern California (other than the weather, food and family)?

ED: Beyond the obvious, I miss everyday life's close-knit sense of community and diverse cultures. Southern California has this unique blend of people and experiences that makes you feel connected to everyone around you. I also miss the mountains and the ability to easily go hiking or enjoy nature just a short drive away.

HCSC: What do you miss most about Southern California (other than the weather, food and family)?

ED: What I miss most about Southern California is being central to everything. Living in Southern California means that in less than two hours, at least from Riverside, I can drive out to the beach, to Mexico, to the mountains, to a lake, to Disneyland, or to the big city of Los Angeles. Boston is based more on public transportation and the roads are designed in such a way that a 5 mile drive can take up to 30 minutes. Southern California, although notorious for traffic, is much better for this and is what I miss most.

HCSC: How do you think Southern California will figure into your future after Harvard?

ED: After Harvard, I hope to return to Southern California to start my career as a mechanical engineer. I am definitely open to living outside of Southern California, but I would hope to raise my family here, if possible.
