Harvard Class of 2014 — Admissions Decisions Sent

On April 1st, Harvard Admissions e-mailed its decisions to the more than 30,000 applicants for the Class of 2014. This year's applicant pool again represented the largest number of applicants in history. Just over 2,100 students were offered admissions and if historical yield rates hold, it would result in an entering Freshman class of approximately 1,680. Southern California had a total of 2,458 applicants and 135 students were admitted, for an acceptance rate of 5.5%, slightly better than the 5.3% acceptance rate last year.

Jonathan Baskin, Schools Committee Chairman, commented, "This class of admitted students represents a diverse set of backgrounds, skills and interests, with the common thread being that they are all among the top high school students in the world." Admitted students and their parents from Southern California were invited to attend receptions in Orange County and Pasadena to meet with alumni and other admitted students. Harvard also hosted a weekend in Cambridge for admitted students to experience life in the Yard. Final decisions for admitted students were due on May 1st. The Harvard Prize Book Program is underway! Each year the Harvard Club of Southern California administers the Prize Book Program for the greater Southern California area, encompassing the counties of Los Angeles, Orange, Ventura, San Bernardino, and Riverside. The Club awards The Harvard Book, a collection of insightful essays penned by distinguished Harvard alumni over the centuries, to outstanding high school students in their junior year. The winners are selected by their respective schools. Please continue your generous support of the Harvard Club Prize Book Program. Our Prize Book Program is one of the largest in the world, and last year came close to supplanting the Boston Club as the biggest. With your help, the Harvard Club of Southern California will be the most successful!

The Harvard Book is presented to high school juniors who "display excellence in scholarship and high character, combined with achievement in other fields." Aside from a few exceptional circumstances, there is one Prize Book awarded per school. The Prize Book Program serves a number of valuable functions. First, it allows Harvard to identify promising high school students in the region, particularly accomplished students who have made positive contributions to their school and community. The program and the award raise the profile of Harvard in the area, oftentimes prompting talented juniors to apply to prominent out-of-state universities (and especially Harvard), which they might not have considered prior to receiving the Prize Book. The Prize Book Program also helps Harvard establish better communications with local schools. Sponsors are given the opportunity to award the Prize Books personally.

This year, our goal is to increase sponsorship to allow us to distribute 200 Prize Books. As was the case last year, donors are invited to contribute to a particular school for 1, 3, 5 or 10 years. 
