#### President's Message

To My Fellow Alumni,

The COVID-19 pandemic continues and so does the Club's commitment to help. Last month, our call to alumni to suggest ways to give provided a plethora of causes. An overwhelming

number focused on food insecurity and feeding frontline health-care workers. Allow me to highlight four of those.

Off Their Plate: Founded by Harvard Medical School student Natalie Guo MBA '18, this is a grassroots movement to feed frontline COVID-19 healthcare workers nutritious meals while restoring the jobs of restaurant employees. The L.A. chapter is run by Serrena Iyer MBA '18 with a staff of exclusively volunteers, so nearly 100% of your donation goes directly to those who need it at 25 hospitals. Further, at least 50% of the money spent on restaurant partners goes directly to their employees' economic relief. In its short, two month existence, Off Their Plate has raised over \$3.8 million, translating to over 380,000 meals. Frontline Foods: For Orange County residents looking to impact first responders in their area, this is another grassroot organization, which has distributed over 275,000 meals in its first twelve weeks in partnership with chef José Andrés's World Central Kitchen. HopeNet Los Angeles: This organization stocks and supports 12 different food pantries across L.A., serving thousands of food-insecure Angelenos. The COVID-19 crisis has seriously compromised its ongoing work, most notably due to the cancellation of its annual fundraiser, the Taste of Larchmont. Second Harvest Food Bank of Orange County: According to its website, the face of hunger in Orange County is varied and includes the young and old, along with hard-working parents who struggle to provide food for their families. Second Harvest has been the leading O.C. affiliate of the Feeding America food bank program and now, during the pandemic, it has been laser-focused on an 8-week food crisis plan in light of school closures, quarantined seniors, and reduced grocery supply. Simply put, they need funding to purchase truckloads of shelf-stable food as they are committed to keep "food flowing." Donations can be made at https://www.feedoc.org/donate-now/.

The Club is also trying to be attentive to Harvard undergrads, especially the Class of 2020 who are about to graduate into "the fellowship of educated (but unemployed) persons." Two programs are being promoted by the Harvard Office of Career Services to support them during this time of historic difficulty:

Crimson Careers: This is the centralized hub for jobs and internships available to Harvard students. Firsthand Advisers: The OCS Firsthand Advisers platform provides scheduling and connection tools to facilitate "flash mentoring." Alumni can offer 30 to 60 minutes to engage in a mock interview, review a resume or CV or have a career chat. Public service mentors are in particular demand. Need help registering? #### Remembering Myron Kayton MS '56

The Harvard Club of Southern California mourns the passing of Myron Kayton MS '56. Myron was deeply involved in the Club, having served on the board from 1974 to 1983 in a variety of roles including president, membership committee chair, first and second vice president, and computerization committee chair. Born April 26, 1934 in New York City, Myron received a BS in mechanical engineering from Cooper Union, an MS in electrical engineering from Harvard, and a PhD in philosophy with a concentration in instrumentation from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He was one of the more brilliant minds that walked this earth. And BEYOND...

That's because from 1965 to 1968 Myron served as Deputy Manager for Lunar Module Guidance and Control at NASA's Johnson Space Center. His office directed the contractors designing two inertial navigation systems, an alignment telescope, the flight controls, crew station, and two radars. He next worked at TRW, where he served as chief engineer for spacelab avionics, head of system engineering for space shuttle avionics, and project engineer for the electronics of the inertial upper stage and a nuclear power plant.

Myron was a Life Fellow of the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE) and served two terms as president of its Aerospace and Electronics Systems Society. He was an IEEE Distinguished Lecturer and the author of numerous papers and of the standard reference text *Avionics and Navigation Systems and Navigation: Land, Sea, Air and Space.* In addition, he was an avid tennis player. We at the Harvard Club of Southern California will miss him greatly.
