Q & A from 02138: Samantha Shelton '23



Samantha Shelton '23, a concentrator in Psychology with a secondary in Theatre, Dance & Media, is one of Harvard Swimming's most distinguished team members. She was born in San Antonio, TX, and graduated from Santa Margarita High School in Rancho Santa Margarita, California where she specialized in middle-distance freestyle, backstroke, and individual medley events. She was a two-time captain of the varsity swim team which won the CIF championships all four years she was there. She was named OC Varsity Swimmer of the Year twice, and was a four-time Trinity League Most Valuable Swimmer. She represented the USA at the 2015 Junior World Championships in Singapore, and qualified in five events for the 2016 Olympic Trials. She was named to the SMCHS 4.0 Honor Roll all four years.

Shelton is a senior residing in Cabot House. At Harvard, she is a current member of the Harvard Varsity Women's Swim and Dive Team and Women in Athletics Club. She is a 2019 and 2020 NCAA qualifier, 2019 Ivy League High Point award winner, six-time Ivy League champion, 2023 Ivy League High Point Career winner, a member of the 2023 All-Ivy First Team in the 200 freestyle, 200 backstroke, 400 individual medley, and she was named to the 2023 Academic-All Ivy Team. She spent her summer training in Austin, Texas and interning with the 2022 International diiVe Consulting Program where she consulted for Two Oceans Foundation, an ocean sustainability company based in Cape Town, South Africa.

HCSC: What surprised you about being a student at Harvard?

SS: I was most surprised by the people at Harvard. When I was a freshman, I remember meeting so many students from different backgrounds, each bringing their own unique story and upbringing to campus. I continue to be in awe of the diversity on campus.

HCSC: When was the first time you visited Harvard and what were your impressions?

SS: The first time I visited Harvard was in 2017 during my junior year in high school for an unofficial recruiting visit. Everyone I met at Harvard was very welcoming and kind. I remember being amazed by the history surrounding Harvard, the unique architecture, and how diverse the student body was.

HCSC: What was your favorite class (or professor) and why?

SS: My favorite class has been CS 32 which is an intro to computer science course. I especially enjoyed this course because it pushed me out of my comfort zone, I learned a lot about machine learning and building programs that I wouldn't have learned had I not enrolled in the course.

HCSC: What has been your funniest moment at Harvard?

SS: My funniest moments at Harvard have been with the swim team. We always have fun chats in the locker room, and our bus rides to travel competitions are also very hilarious, especially when we entertain ourselves with live karaoke.

HCSC: If you were the President of Harvard, what would you change?

SS: If I were President of Harvard, I would create more food selections in the dining halls and allow students to eat in the dining hall any time of the day.

HCSC: What do you miss most about Southern California (other than the weather, food, and family)?

SS: What I miss the most are the beautiful hiking trails near my home in Laguna Beach, and watching the sunrises during morning runs.

HCSC: How will Southern California figure into your future after Harvard?

SS: I think I'll be back in Southern California after graduation. If not in the future for my career, then eventually down the line when I raise a family.

HCSC: How did you manage the transition to virtual classes?

SS: It was very hard for me to transition from in-person classes to Zoom. At the end of my sophomore year I decided to take a gap year, and I spent my time training for the 2020 Olympic Swimming Trials.

HCSC: What are your plans after graduation?

SS: This summer, I plan to continue training for the 2024 Olympic Swimming Trials and work in a psychology research lab in preparation for grad school. I hope to pursue my master's in Psychology later (post-Olympic Trials).
