Alumni Urged to Host "January Experiences" for Harvard Undergrads

For the second year, Harvard students from throughout the University are available for externships and short term projects in Southern California during the University's Winter Break, from Monday, January 3 -Friday, January 21, a period of three weeks.

Harvard's adoption of a common calendar, where final examinations are conducted before the winter holidays in each of Harvard's schools, has led to the January term. January Experiences can include short-term externships (one day, a few days, a week, or up to three weeks) and "shadowing opportunities" in which a student acompanies an alum to meetings on a typical work day, in all professional fields.

January Experiences with students may include attending workplace meetings, touring alumni workplaces, discussing industry trends, observing client or internal interactions, conducting informational interviews with colleagues, undertaking a small project or relevant research assignment, among others. A student January Experience is usually unpaid.

The most important aspect of alumni involvement in developing a January Experience is willingness to share and provide advice on career pathways. Alumni employers are encouraged to post a "January Experience" for undergraduates via the online database offered through the Harvard Office of Career Services for Harvard undergraduates, Crimson Careers, at https://harvard-csm.symplicity.com. Please use the word "January" in the title.

Harvard Club President Dan Medina said that the Club has formed a "January Experience Job Bank" for Harvard students who are returning to our region in January. "We are delighted to have the opportunity to have Harvard students engage with our alumni on career prospects in Southern California," Medina said.

Harvard in Hollywood 2010: The NEW New Media

The fifth annual Harvard in Hollywood symposium, "The NEW New Media," focused on ways in which the media has revolutionized the way audiences interact with pop culture and entertainment. The event, which was held on October 30, was attended by approximately 150 alumni.

Panels included topics such as "Is Content Still King? Storytelling and Story-selling in the Digital Age", moderated by Marty Kaplan AB '71, USC's Norman Lear Professor of Entertainment, Media, and Society. The panel discussed the impact of digital media on the content side of show business.

Harvard-Yale Football 11/20/10: Fourth Straight Victory! Harvard Wins 28-21

For the fourth consecutive year, Harvard football fans were treated to a Crimson victory at Yankee Doodles in Santa Monica, as over 120 Harvard and Yale supporters gathered to watch the 127th edition of The Game.

With its 28-21 victory, the Harvard football team extended its decade-long dominance over the Bulldogs to an astonishing but perfectly acceptable nine wins in the last 11 years. Their fourth consecutive victory has been matched only four other times since the rivalry commenced in 1875, a fact not lost on either side (especially as the TV commentators kept referring to it).

Both Harvard and Yale supporters donned their team colors (and "spirited" themed T-shirts) as the Bulldogs took leads of 7-0 and 14-7 before three straight Harvard touchdowns put the Crimson ahead for good. The Harvard club's secret weapon at Yankee Doodles, however, was alumnus Dr. Richard Allen Williams '57, a former Harvard band member whose trumpeted renditions of "10,000 Men of Harvard" and "Fair Harvard" after Harvard's touchdowns helped fill the hall with cheering Crimson fans.



After having served for the past two years as President of the Harvard Club of Southern California, I was delighted to be asked to accept a three-year appointment a Director of the Harvard Alumni Association (HAA) for the Pacific Southwest. The HAA kicked off the current

academic year with a three-day Fall Board of Directors meeting in mid-October.

The HAA supports a network of over 360,000 Harvard Alumni around the world. Founded in 1840, the HAA's mission remains "The promotion of the welfare of Harvard University and the establishment of a mutually beneficial relationship between Harvard University and its alumni."
