




Be a Part of the 133rd Edition of The Game!

Harvard Winternships: Host a Harvard Student in Your Workplace This January

For the fourth consecutive year, the Club is coordinating opportunities for alumni to connect with under graduates as part of the 2017 January Winternship Program, through Harvard's Office of Career Services.

A Winternship is essentially an externship, an unpaid job-shadowing experience in the workplace, lasting anywhere from one to 15 days during the January winter break (January 2-20). Winternships allow students to observe and ask questions, receive hands-on experience, learn about particular or ganizations or industries, and build relationships. An essential part of a January W internship is alumni willingness to share their career pathway with current Harvard students.

Proposals for Winternships should be submitted to OCS at http://ocs.fas.harvard.edu/wintersession. Proposals will be accepted through early November and will be reviewed to gauge student interest and poten - tial learning outcomes. Students begin searching for W internships in mid-October. Though they are generally responsible for their own travel and housing, OCS does provide some funding to cover the travel costs for students needing financial assistance.

As in years past, there will also be a mixer held in early January , 2017 to allow local under graduates and alumni to arrange last minute Winternship experiences and discuss career paths and industry trends in various fields. Q&A from 02138... Madeline Lear '17



Madeline Lear '17, a concentrator in History pursuing a secondary in Film and V ideo Production, was born in Los Angeles and graduated from Harvard-Westlake High School. She is a senior residing in Quincy House. At Harvard, she has pursued documentary film and photog - raphy, and served as the multimedia editor of *The Harvard Crimson*. She is currently conducting thesis research on a community of Catholic sisters in Portland, Oregon, while also producing a short film about the present-day life of women in religion. Most recently , Madeline interned at Blue Chalk Media following internships at *The Sacramento Bee* in California and *The Patriot Ledger* in Quincy, Massachusetts, where she produced a short film about two brothers' struggle with heroin addiction.

HCSC: What surprised you about being a student at Harvard?

ML: I was lucky enough to attend a really good high school before I came to Harvard, and counselors often told students in my class that college would be easy. For me, that was not the case. While I felt prepared coming to college, I have constantly had to push myself in order to produce work I can be proud of, and I believe the same is true for my peers. Likewise, I had imagined Harvard as a place where everyone you meet is a math genius and every lecture will blow your mind. I was surprised to find everyone is not a math genius and you may have to do a little digging to experience the greatest class of all time, (but it's there if you look!)

HCSC: When was the first time you visited Harvard and what were your impressions at that time?

ML: I visited Harvard as a junior in high school and really disliked it actually. It was the one school I ruled out. The tour and info session made me feel as if Harvard assumed you would apply, so it did not need to make an effort. What changed my mind was reading about the V isual and Environmental Studies (VES) department. Its philosophy of studying how people interact with space is incredibly abstract, and broke any certainty I had in my conception of the school.

HCSC: What was your favorite class (or professor) and why?

ML: My favorite professor is Robb Moss, the chair of the V isual and Environmental Studies department, who teaches film - making. Each class, he and ten students sit around a table and watch students' footage. He absorbs the emotional and technical aspects of a film all at once, and relates them back with grace and thoughtfulness I hope to emulate.

HCSC: What has been your funniest moment at Harvard?

ML: VES Prof. Ross McElwee makes brilliant films that he narrates in a warm southern accent. One time I was at a reception following a screening at the Carpenter Center and heard his voice in the crowd. Never having met him before, I turned and said in earnest, "You have such a nice voice." He was perfectly polite in turn, while I turned pink.

HCSC: If you were President of Harvard, what would change?

ML: I have had a great experience at Harvard so far, and while I disagree with certain University policies, this is a dangerous question that I should unfortunately avoid as a current member of the newspaper. It's safe to say there would be less friction on campus if the administration engaged under graduate students more in determining changes to student life. On a less contro - versial note, I would consider MIT's policy of grading on a pass/fail basis during the first semester of freshman year .

HCSC: What do you miss most about Southern California (other than the weather and family)?

ML: Los Angeles is a never-ending film-food-life of a city, and when I'm in Cambridge I miss being able to explore it.

HCSC: How do you think Southern California will figure into your future after Harvard?

ML: I hope to make documentary films, and am happy to live wherever that is most possible. Los Angeles may be the place.

HCSC: How has being at Harvard shaped your interests and changed how you see the world?

ML: It took me until junior year to find that I wished to study women's religious history . Prof. Laurel Ulrich taught a class about American families in which she mentioned a badass (paraphrasing, here) group of nuns called the Ursulines. I had never before thought of a religious community as a type of family , and had imagined Catholic sisters simply as passive parts of a patriarchal organization. My assumptions soon proved weak, and the agency and grit of women religious in American history has fascinated me every since. With an incredible Divinity school, history, and film departments, Harvard is helping me mold a project I look forward to working on every day.
