<u>Upcoming Harvard Elections:</u> HCSC Board Endorses Two Local Candidates in Spring HAA Elections

At the February board meeting, the HCSC Board voted to endorse Nworah Ayogu '10, MD '15, MBA '15 for Harvard Overseer, and Madeleine Mejia EdM '00 for HAA Elected Director.



Nworah Ayogu '10, MD '15, MBA '15 has been nominated to serve a six-year term as a Harvard Overseer. Dr. Ayogu is the General Manager and Chief Medical Officer of Amazon Clinic. If elected, he would join one of the two governing bodies of Harvard University. Harvard Overseers provide counsel to the University's leaders

on a wide range of concerns including strategic direction and review of the University's schools, departments, activities, and programs. An interview with Dr. Ayogu is included on page 6.



Madeleine Mejia, Ed.M. '00, a long-time HCSC board officer, has been nominated to serve a three-year term as a Harvard Alumni Association Elected Director. She is an assistant professor of literacy and reading education at California State University, Fullerton. If elected, she would serve on the HAA Board, an alumni

advisory body that aims to foster a sense of community, engagement, and University citizenship among Harvard alumni around the world. HAA Elected Directors provide leadership for the HAA and its various committees, a capacity often demonstrated by a record of service to Harvard and an ability to communicate widely and effectively with other alumni. Voting begins April 1. Eligible voters will have the option of voting either online or by paper ballot. Completed ballots must be received by 5 p.m. (EDT) on May 14. All holders of Harvard degrees may vote.



Q & A from 02138: Marbella Marlo '24



Marbella Marlo '24, a concentrator in History and English, was born in Newport Beach, CA, and graduated from Corona del Mar High School where she served as the captain of the Varsity Sailing Team and was Valedictorian of her graduating class. She was the founder and president of Newport Beach's Council of Youth Ambassadors, an internship program for high school students and the City of Newport Beach. She is a senior residing in Mather House. Her brother, Jake Marlo, graduated in 2022 and lived in Adams House. At Harvard, she was the Editor-in-Chief of the Harvard Independent and an active member of the Harvard Sailing Team. She wrote for The New York Sun two summers ago as an editorial intern. Last summer, she worked at Morgan Stanley as a Wealth Management Summer Analyst, and she will be returning to work there full time in New York City after her graduation.

HCSC: What surprised you about being a student at Harvard?

MM: The biggest culture shock for me was how talented, ambitious, and passionate everyone was in their respective fields. Many people had the same interests and perspectives back home in Southern California, so it was very interesting to experience life with so many different points of view.

HCSC: When was the first time you visited Harvard, and what were your impressions?

MM: The first time I visited Harvard was in the summer of 2018, dropping my older brother off for his freshman year. I thought the campus was beautiful and intimidating.

HCSC: What was your favorite class (or professor), and why?

MM: My favorite class so far (which I am currently enrolled in) is English 151AN: The Age of the Novel, by Professor Tara Menon. I've taken numerous English classes here at Harvard, and I've always found something very special about learning how such traditional and renowned stories still have relevance today. Professor Menon also teaches such complex themes from these novels in a very engaging way.

HCSC: What has been your funniest moment at Harvard?

MM: My funniest moment was probably this past fall, when we were studying the work of the philosopher Amartya Sen in an economics class. I had scheduled office hours with my professor, not realizing that she (Emma Rothschild) and Amartya Sen were married. The office hours were at her house, and at the end of our hour-long conversation regarding Sen's work, she invited me in to meet him. I was incredibly caught off guard.

HCSC: What do you miss most about Southern California (other than the weather, food, and family)?

MM: Sometimes I miss how slow-paced the Southern California lifestyle is. It's very easy to get caught up in trying to be the best at everything, and it's rare to find anyone stopping and appreciating the small victories in life.

HCSC: How do you think Southern California will figure into your future after Harvard?

MM: I'm a sixth-generation Californian, so I hope to return to the West Coast one day!

Interview with Harvard Overseer Candidate, Nworah Ayogu '10, MD '15, MBA '15

Q. Please tell us about yourself.

A. I live in the Los Angeles area with my wife and almost 2-year-old son. I am a physician, and I have spent my career working at the intersection of medicine, technology, and business. I've spent the last several years at Amazon leading their efforts in healthcare, first as Chief Medical Officer of Amazon Pharmacy, and now as the General Manager of Amazon Clinic.

Q. Please tell us a bit about your Harvard experience.

A. While at Harvard, I spent time working with and advocating for the Boston community as part of PBHA and the Black Men's Forum. As the Student Chair of the Harvard Foundation for Intercultural and Race Relations, I spent a lot of time working with the University and with the multitude of cultural organizations on campus to ensure that Harvard was a safe place for learning, dialogue, and expression.

Q. What do you hope to accomplish as a Harvard Overseer?

A. I firmly believe that the key challenges facing Harvard mirror those facing the world:

- 1. Driving technological innovation,
- 2. Embracing diversity and fostering community, and
- 3. Promoting justice specifically inequity and climate change.

The role of the Board of Overseers is to support the President and senior officers by "contributing to reasoned deliberations, exercising careful and independent judgment, offering thoughtful, broad-based, and candid comments, asking probing questions, respecting the views of others, and maintaining the collegial character of the Board's discussions." This means listening and providing a broad perspective, informed not only by my experience but those of my peers, colleagues and friends. It means inspecting the strategic priorities of each school to make sure they are aligned with values of the broader community and focused on the issues of greatest import; and asking critical questions to make sure that our pedagogy is evolving to meet the everchanging environment students find themselves in.

Q. Final thoughts?

A. Harvard is an institution that has given me so much, and I'm honored to have the opportunity to give back to it.

Q. Please tell us about yourself.

Q. Why do you want to serve as an HAA Elected Director?

A. My goal is to contribute to the Harvard community's continued vibrancy, ensuring that the sense of togetherness and shared purpose that defined my student experience persists and grows stronger for current and future generations of Harvard alumni. If elected, I am committed to giving back to the institution that has played a pivotal role in my personal and professional development. I plan to leverage my experiences and dedication to enhance the alumni experience, promote engagement at a larger scale, and strengthen the bonds that make the Harvard community truly exceptional.
