Harvard College Admissions Dean William Fitzsimmons To Visit Southern California

William R. Fitzsimmons, Harvard College Dean of Admissions and Financial Aid, will be the highlighted speaker at two receptions for Club members and their guests in Southern California on Wednesday, October 5, 2011 in Orange County and Los Angeles (see page 5 for more details).

Fitzsimmons and his colleagues, Sally Clark Donahue, Director of Financial Aid for Harvard College, and Marlyn E. McGrath, Director of Admissions for Harvard College, will speak to Club members on the subject "Back to the Future: Harvard's Return to Early Admission."

In the 2010-2011 admissions year, Harvard College received nearly 35,000 applications, an increase of 15 percent over the previous year. Harvard has announced that in 2011-2012 it will reintroduce non-binding early action for prospective students.

The Southern California receptions will each take place on Wednesday, October 5. The Orange County event will take place at 12:00 noon at the Hyatt Regency Huntington Beach. Harvard Club Seeks Alumni Interviewers



The Harvard Club of Southern California is recruiting new alumni interviewers to participate in its 2011-2012 admissions season.

Hundreds of new and veteran alumni interviewers will be trained by Harvard College admissions officers during workshops that are scheduled to take place throughout the Southern California region in October.

In 2011-2012, almost 2,600 applicants to Harvard College from Southern California were interviewed for the Class of 2015. 135 students from our region were admitted. 107 Harvard freshmen from Southern California attended the Freshman Convocation held in Cambridge on August 30.

"We look forward to another record year," said Jonathan Baskin, the Club's Vice President for Schools. "Harvard is reinstating Early Action, its non-binding admissions program. This will no doubt increase our applicant pool and lead to an early start to the interviewing season," he said.


