John Harvard Award Recipient: David W. Oxtoby AB '72 President of Pomona College

David W. Oxtoby AB '72, President of Pomona College and member of the Harvard Board of Overseers, will be this year's recipient of the Club's John Harvard Award for Distinguished Community Service.

Under President Oxtoby's leadership, Pomona College has been ranked one of the top 10 best managed colleges in the nation. The Princeton Review ranks Pomona College #1 nationally as offering "the best classroom experience." Oxtoby has launched initiatives in sustainability - including integrated academic and campus planning, and an office of sustainability - and carried out renovations of several historic campus buildings. Pomona's financial aid program is regarded as one of the most generous in the nation.

David Oxtoby grew up in Bryn Mawr, PA, and graduated summa cum laude from Harvard College with an AB in Chemistry and Physics. He received his Ph.D. in Chemistry from UC Berkeley. Prior to being named Pomona's 9th President, he served as Dean of the Division of Physical Sciences at the University of Chicago. He and his wife, Claire, have three children.

Education Roundtable: Performance-Based Learning at Barack Obama Charter School

In 1995, Chugach School District was one of the lowest performing school districts in Alaska. New leaders introduced a novel education program that featured advancing students at their own rate based on their performance level, not their grade level. By 2001 Chugach was the highest performing school district in Alaska and one of the first two school districts in the nation

to win the Baldrige Award, the nation's highest award for organizational excellence.

Glenn Noreen, MBA '82, is the Executive Director of Barack Obama Charter School (http://www.barackobamacharter.org/), which is based on the Chugach model. At this roundtable, Glenn will present the performance-based learning program design and report on his recent trip to Kunskapsskolan (http://www.kunskapsskolan.se/foretaget/inenglish.4.1d32e45f86b8ae04c7fff213.html) in Sweden. 
