### The Southern California Class of 2014 Is Off to Cambridge

OCTOBER 2010

The Club extends congratulations to the 102 Southern California students who began their Harvard careers in the Class of 2014 last month. A record 2,410 applicants from Southern California sought admission to Harvard College this year, yielding 129 admitted students, the highest ever recorded from our region. The large number of applicants from our region and nationally is attributed in part to Harvard's generous financial aid initiative, which has been maintained despite severe budget cuts in almost all other parts of the University due to unprecedented losses in the endowment.

"We extend our sincere thanks to our army of more than 700 Schools Committee members who endeavored to complete the extraordinary task of interviewing all of our applicants," said Jonathan Baskin, Schools Committee Chair. "We especially thank our Area chairs who took on the responsibility of organizing this interviewing effort, assigning the interviews and doing many themselves: West Los Angeles – Jody Siegler and Brock Walsh; Central Los Angeles – Dan Medina; San Fernando Valley – Mark Goldstein; South Bay – Karen Mayfield; San Gabriel Valley – Kiguel and Claudia Palos; Riverside/San Bernardino Counties – Peggy Campo and James Rhodes; North Orange County – Anne and Jeff Sinek, and Kent Fernandez; and South Orange County – Richard Cowan."

The Club needs to recruit additional interviewers in every region except West Los Angeles. ### Harvard Students Available in January 2011 For Externships, Projects In Southern California



For the second year, Harvard students from throughout the University are available for externships and short term projects in Southern California during the University's Winter Break, from Monday, January 3 - Friday, January 21, a period of three weeks. Harvard's adoption of a common calendar, where final examinations are conducted before the winter holidays in each of Harvard's schools, has led to the January term.

January Experiences can include short-term externships (one day, a few days, a week, or up to three weeks) and "shadowing opportunities" in which a student acompanies an alum to meetings on a typical work day, in all professional fields. January Experiences with students may include attending workplace meetings, touring alumni workplaces, discussing industry trends, observing client or internal interactions, conducting informational interviews with colleagues, undertaking a small project or relevant research assignment, among others. A student January Experience is usually unpaid. The most important aspect of alumni involvement in developing a January Experience is willingness to share and provide advice on career pathways.

Alumni employers are encouraged to post a "January Experience" for undergraduates via the online database offered through the Harvard Office of Career Services for Harvard undergraduates, Crimson Careers, at https://harvard-csm.symplicity.com. Please use the word "January" in the title. Alumni can register to act as career mentors during this period through the University's website. Students are being instructed to check with the website for opportunities of interest in their home areas.

Harvard Club President Dan Medina announced earlier this month that the Club has formed a "January Experience Job Bank" for Harvard students who are returning to our region in January. "We are delighted to have the opportunity to have Harvard students engage with our alumni on career prospects in Southern California," Medina said.




