

### Q & A from 02138:

### Katherine McPhie, '24/'25



Katherine McPhie, '24/'25, a computer science concentrator who grew up in Irvine, attends Harvard on a four-year, full-ride presidential scholarship as a Coolidge Scholar. An accomplished musician, Katherine sang in the Orange County Millennial Choir, played trumpet and piano, and served as the Drum Major for University High School's Marching Band. She also served on the board of her high school's Junior Classical League and was a National Latin Exam winner. Katherine's high school team won second place at the International Space Settlement Design Competition at the Kennedy Space Center. During high school, Katherine worked as a research intern at the University of California at Irvine, performing mathematical modeling of unstructured proteins. She is a national winner of the NCWIT Computing Award and the General Motors STEM for Changemaking Challenge. The Orange County Register named Katherine as one of their Top 100 Most Influential People in Orange County, and Diversity in Action magazine named her "20 Under 20: Young Innovators Who Are Already Changing the World." She won the Gloria Barron Prize for Young Heroes and the Prudential Spirit of Community Award for her work in the tech-for-good space. After completing three semesters at Harvard, Katherine took an 18-month leave of absence to serve as a missionary for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Scotland and Northern Ireland. She is currently a second-semester sophomore residing in Mather House. She is the daughter of Erin ('98) and David McPhie ('98/'00, HLS '03). At Harvard, Katherine has served as an Associate Director of Tech & Media for Harvard Women Engineers Code, and is a member of the Harvard Open Data Project, the Harvard Computer Society, and Harvard Women in Computer Science. She enjoys singing with the Harvard University Choir, and is a past member of the Harvard Wind Ensemble. Katherine is active in her church community, and is a member of Harvard's Christian Faith and Action club and the Harvard Latter-day Saint Student Association. Katherine has spent her college summers working as an Information Research Intern at Dow Chemical, and as a Firmware Development Engineer Intern at Western Digital. This summer she is seeking to do a study abroad program in Taiwan. After graduation, she plans to work as a software engineer.

## HCSC: When was the first time you visited Harvard, and what were your impressions?

KM: When I was born, my parents were serving as Resident Tutors in Pforzheimer House, so I actually lived in PfoHo for the first year of my life. But after that, I didn't go back until I was 12. I remember thinking that there were a lot of brick buildings.

## HCSC: What was your favorite class (or professor) and why?

KM: I have loved many of my classes. My Mandarin and Russian classes have been particularly enjoyable because I really enjoy languages.

## HCSC: What has been your funniest moment at Harvard?

KM: Some of my funniest and happiest memories of Harvard were from the summer after my first year. I lived with a few other Harvard computer science concentrators in an apartment in New York City. We all had internships that summer, and we just had such a great time living together!

# HCSC: What do you miss most about Southern California (other than the weather, food and family)?

KM: I miss how good and fresh the air smells!

# HCSC: How do you think Southern California will figure into your future after Harvard?

KM: I would love to move back to Southern California and raise a family there. We'll see!

## HCSC: How did you manage the transition to virtual classes?

KM: Having classes on Zoom was tough and I'm so grateful to be in-person now. One thing that perhaps helped was getting curious about the pandemic. For my main project in the data class that I took that spring, some classmates and I mapped the way Harvard first-years made social connections during the Covid-19 pandemic. Long story short, it was a difficult time for everyone.
