Lucy Fisher, Producer, Red Wagon Entertainment

Lucy Fisher, former Vice Chairman of the Columbia Tri-Star Motion Picture Group at Sony Pictures, is an award-winning motion picture producer and Co-head of Red Wagon Entertainment. Fisher and Red Wagon's most recent production "The Great Gatsby" stars Leonardo DiCaprio and Tobey Maguire. During Fisher's tenure as Vice Chairman at Sony, she supervised films, including "Men in Black," "My Best Friend's Wedding," "Air Force One," "Jerry Maguire," "As Good As It Gets" and "Stuart Little." Children's Center, which has since provided care for over 2,000 children. After their youngest daughter was diagnosed with juvenile diabetes, Fisher and Wick, along with another family, co-founded "CuresNow" to promote regenerative medicine and stem cell research. Fisher served as co-chair of Prop 71, the successful Stem Cell initiative in California, which now awards 3 billion dollars for stem cell research in California. Her family Walk Team "Tessa's Troopers," has raised millions of dollars for JDRF (The Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation). Fisher currently serves as the Vice Chair of the Executive Committee of the Harvard Board of Overseers and as Advisor to the Harvard Office of the Arts. In 1983 she founded the Peter Ivers Visiting Artist Residency at Harvard which annually brings prominent artists to Harvard's campus.

Fisher recalled her memories as a sophomore in April 1969 running from the steps of University Hall, protesting the Vietnam War, to the Signet Society (The Harvard Literary Club), where she worked as a waitress, to serve lunch to the literary ruling class: "For me this commute was the heart of my experience at Harvard; the ability to have one part of my day engaged in seismic social change while on the same day I could quietly ponder T.S. Eliot's initiation rose, which he had subsequently returned to The Signet, now pressed inside the pages of his first book." Reflecting back, Fisher says, "[s]ince my last visit to University Hall had ended the way it did, I never expected to be nominated to Harvard's Board of Overseers. But having now had the chance to serve on it, and having had the privilege of getting a closer look at Harvard and the wonder of its unimaginable magnitude, I feel honored and lucky to have been able to receive this further education."



Thomas C. Hudnut (Educator of the Year) has been President and Chief Executive Officer of Harvard-Westlake School since 1987. A magna cum laude graduate of Princeton University, Hudnut also holds a master's degree in diplomatic history and international relations from the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy at Tufts University. He is currently President-General of The Cum Laude Society, and a Trustee of The Woodrow Wilson National Fellowship Foundation, the Good Hope Medical Foundation, and Deep Springs College. He has been a trustee of six independent schools and the Treasurer and a director of School Year Abroad, Inc.



Cynthia Torres AB '80, MBA '84 (Fred Smith Award for Outstanding Service to the Harvard Club of Southern California). Over a span of 17 years, Cynthia has served as a strong club alumni leader in various roles including Regional Director of the Harvard Alumni Association, President, Executive Vice President, Chair of the Nominating Committee, Vice President of Communications, and Vice President of Programs. The Harvard Alumni Association's Board has recently elected her to serve as the HAA's First Vice President for the 2013-2014 school year. She will serve as the global President of the 360,000 member Harvard Alumni Association in 2014-2015. She has served as a mentor and advisor to many recent officers of the HCSC. She is married to Michael Gisser AB '77. They are the parents of Spencer Gisser '14 and of David Gisser, who is a junior in high school.

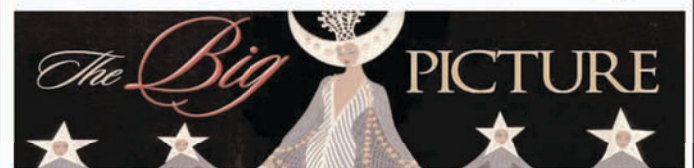

Q&A from 02138... Ben Samuels '13

(These interviews are a regular contribution to the HCSC Newsletter and will spotlight students enrolled at Harvard who are from Southern California)

E. Benjamin ("Ben") Samuels '13 was born in Norwalk, Connecticut. He graduated from Polytechnic School in Pasadena where he served as editor-in-chief of the newspaper and captain of the high school golf team. Samuels is a Near Eastern Languages and Civilizations concentrator and Lowell House resident.

In 2011, he was elected to lead the 139th Guard of the Harvard Crimson, having been the Operations Manager and a Sports executive, covering Harvard football. He was recently succeeded by his brother, Robert ("Bobby") Samuels '14, marking the first time that two siblings have been elected President of The Crimson since before World War II. The Crimson, founded in 1873, is the only daily newspaper in Cambridge, Massachusetts and the oldest continuously published daily college newspaper.

HCSC: *What advice did you give your younger brother about whether he should go to Harvard?*

EBS: I think once he got in, I really didn't have to give him much advice or do much convincing. I actually tried to back myself out a bit so that he could come to the decision on his own—and fortunately, he made the right one.

HCSC: *Once he enrolled, what advice have you given him along the way?*

EBS: Honestly, nothing too significant. He and I have had very different academic careers at Harvard, so my advice wouldn't be too valuable to him anyway. On The Crimson, of course, we confer about a number of different things, and I'll give him pointers (and how to avoid my own mistakes) from time to time. There is a truism about working on The Crimson: if you don't like the work, you won't have fun. And he does a pretty good job keeping that in mind, I think.

HCSC: *Who is your favorite professor and/or what is your favorite course, and why?*

EBS: There have been a few different courses that I've really enjoyed, so it's tough to pick just one. A course I'm taking at the moment that I really enjoy is a Government class on political thought leading up to and during the American Revolution. It's a topic to which I had very little exposure coming into the semester, and I find myself learning something new and interesting during almost every class. What makes the topic so interesting is that when you go year-by-year from 1765 to 1780, the dialogue and discourse in America radically changes almost every year.

HCSC: *What is your take on the Government cheating scandal? What are some overlooked or not widely appreciated information about what happened?*

EBS: I will withhold judgement on this for the moment. As the revelation about the University's intrusion upon private emails indicates, I think that there's a lot we still don't know. We will all be in a better position to make more educated opinions as The Crimson and others continue to reveal the facts of the case.

HCSC: *What challenges did you face during your tenure as Crimson President?*

EBS: When I took over as President, there had been a growing -- and, from our perspective, disturbing -- trend of influence of spokespeople at the University (Harvard Public Affairs & Communications). In addition to closing off some access to administrators, they had pushed The Crimson into a policy of quote review, which meant that they had the right to review certain quotes pre-publication. Fortunately, we were in a position to end that policy, and many other major publications across America came to the same revelation around the same time and followed suit.

HCSC: *If you were President of Harvard, what would you change?*

EBS: This may not be the answer you'd expect from someone who spent his entire college career writing and working for a newspaper, but I would probably like to see an even greater focus on math, science, and engineering at Harvard. In the past decade, you've started to see that, and the capital campaign reflects this focus as well, but I think it's important for the long-term health of the university to continue making this a priority. That, of course, and hot breakfasts.

HCSC: *What are your favorite activities or places to visit in Southern California?*

EBS: The first places I visit when I go home are always restaurants and other food establishments (In 'N Out, Pie 'N Burger, Lucky Boy, etc.). But beyond that, I mostly look forward to spending time with family and friends when I'm at home—nothing too exciting, but it keeps me coming back.

HCSC: *Do you plan to return to Southern California after graduation (near term or future)?*

EBS: It's up in the air. At the very least, I will be home during the summer, but who knows what will happen after that.

HCSC: *What do you plan to do in the year after graduation?*

EBS: I will be working in San Francisco next year as a Business Consultant for Applied Predictive Technologies. It'll be nice to be back on the West Coast and closer to home.

HCSC: *Where do you see yourself in 10 years?*

EBS: I honestly could not even begin to tell you. Hopefully, doing something I enjoy and something that challenges me on a day-to-day basis, but beyond that, I could not really tell you what that might be.
