### Harvard President Alan Garber '77 Visits Southern California

Harvard President Alan Garber '77 addressed over 350 members of the Southern California Harvard community on September 16 at the Four Seasons Hotel Los Angeles in a wide-ranging conversation.

The event was Garber's first visit to an alumni audience since he was appointed to a permanent role as the 31st President of Harvard University.

Harvard Corporation member Diana Nelson '84 held a fireside chat conversation with President Garber, covering Garber's days as a Harvard undergraduate, his work on Stanford's faculty, and his service to Harvard as its provost since 2011. Garber provided insight into the University's priorities, and reported on several of the key initiatives taking place on campus.

Garber became the interim president of Harvard on January 2, 2024, taking the reins after Dr. Claudine Gay's departure.

"The vibe in the room was enthusiastic and supportive," said Cynthia Torres '80, MBA '84, past president of the

Harvard Club of Southern California and past president of the Harvard Alumni Association. "I sensed that people in the audience were interested in what President Garber had to say. President Garber stayed long after the event was over to talk to alumni and listen to their concerns, and that left a positive impression."

Joan Chu Reese '86, HAA Director for Southern California and Hawaii, introduced Garber to the audience. Reese told The Harvard Crimson that Garber came across as "pragmatic" and "a realist."

HAA President Moitri Savard '93, MD, was on hand to meet with alumni and encourage their engagement with the university.

The Harvard Gazette reported that President Garber is urging the campus community "to seek opportunities for unity in a time of divisiveness."

As previously announced, Garber will serve as Harvard's President through the 2026-2027 academic year. A full-scale search for Garber's successor will begin in the late spring or summer of 2026.


### Harvard Club Beach Party 2024



# Volunteer to Serve as a Harvard Alumni Interviewer!

The alumni interview serves as an important part of the admissions process, according to Harry Kim, chair of the Harvard Club of Southern California's Schools Committee. "The Admissions Office views the alumni interview as a critical component of a candidate's application," he said. "This makes it crucial for our area to have sufficient numbers of interviewers to meet the demands of the applicant pool," he added.

Mr. Kim said that the Southern California Schools Committee continued to receive a high volume of alumni interview requests this past year. New interviewers will be trained this fall by experienced members of the HCSC Schools Committee, who may have served as alumni interviewers for decades.

Interviews may be conducted in person or by Zoom, at the option of the interviewer and the applicant.



### Q & A from 02138:

### Mason Hunt '26



Mason Hunt '26, a concentrator in biomedical engineering, graduated from Newport Harbor High School. He was captain of the Boys Varsity Water Polo team which won the Southern Section Open Division CIF Championship. He is a junior residing in Currier House. At Harvard, he is busy playing water polo and taking classes in the Science and Engineering Complex. He just finished his first Varsity water polo season with a second place finish in the Northeast Water Polo Conference after missing last season due to injury.

### HCSC: What surprised you about being a student at Harvard?

MH: What pleasantly surprised me about being a student at Harvard is the remarkable sense of community that transcends the academic environment. Despite the university's broad global impact, the tight-knit communities within the different houses and student organizations create a supportive and inclusive atmosphere. This communal spirit fosters meaningful connections, making the vast and renowned institution feel remarkably personal and interconnected.

### HCSC: When was the first time you visited Harvard, and what were your impressions at that time?

MH: I first came to Harvard on an official visit for the water polo team in April 2022. I was instantly amazed by the sheer amount of history embedded in Harvard's campus and culture. The day I was leaving, my current teammate and I sat down on a bench outside of Adams House and turned around to see an inscription that read "Franklin Delano Roosevelt, 32nd President of The United States lived here in Westmorly Court." My mind was blown.

### HCSC: What was your favorite class (or professor) and why?

MH: My favorite class was a Gen Ed course called Sleep. This class was fascinating because it explored circadian rhythms and the impact that sleep has on overall health. I also learned numerous sleep tips that I have since implemented, greatly improving my quality of sleep.

#### HCSC: What was your funniest moment at Harvard?

MH: One morning, I was walking down Mass Ave after a breakfast at Annenberg, and I saw a huge congregation of people on the street. I was curious what had caused the mass of people to crowd the street, so I walked deeper into the crowd to figure out why. Out of nowhere, Jennifer Coolidge comes gliding down the street in a bright pink fuzzy hat atop a parade float. She had just won Hasty Pudding Woman of the Year.

### HCSC: If you were President of Harvard, what would change?

MH: I would relocate Harvard to Southern California! Harvard is the most magical learning environment in the world and Southern California is the most magical place in the world, so it's a perfect fit.

HCSC: What do you miss most about Southern California (other than the weather, food and family)?

MH: I miss the beach. For me, the beach was a sanctuary where I could be free from my stresses and worries. I've tried to replicate this serene feeling in Cambridge with the Charles River, but it is not quite the same!

MH: Southern California will play an integral role in my future after Harvard. The relaxed atmosphere, the unchanging 75 degrees and sun, and the vibrant beach culture are impossible to beat!
