# Harvard College Admits 3.5% of Southern California Applicants

Following a surge in applications over the past several years, Harvard received 54,008 applications this year, down about 5% from last year, but still marking the fourth consecutive year Harvard received more than 50,000 applications.

Admissions to the Class of 2028 were sent out on March 28. Worldwide, Harvard accepted 3.6% of the applicants, up from 3.4% from the previous year. Southern California received approximately 2,980 applicants this year, a decrease of 8% from 3,242 last year. 35 out of 259 applicants were accepted in the Early Action process, eight Early Action applicants were deferred to Regular Action and then accepted, and 60 were accepted in the Regular Action process (out of 2,721), for a total of 103 acceptances and an overall acceptance rate of 3.5%, up from last year's 2.5%.

"Beyond another strong applicant pool, we are delighted by the stunning array of talents and lived experiences the Class of 2028 will bring with them from throughout the United States and around the world," said William R. Fitzsimmons, dean of admissions and financial aid. The Harvard Club of Southern California hosted events for newly admitted students. On April 7, Marsha Hirano-Nakanishi EdD '81, HCSC Vice President, Membership and Schools, organized a reception for students and their parents at the home of Sonia Molina DMD '89, MPH '89. HCSC Vice President, Radcliffe, Kay Park '87 and HCSC board members Steve Arkow '84, Harry Kim '86, Glenn Nano '98 and Jose Sanchez '89 also attended the event. The event was attended by more than 60 admitted students and a total of more than 150 guests. Final decisions on accepting Harvard's offer of admission are due May 1.

The application process for the Class of 2029 will begin in the late summer. Alumni interested in interviewing applicants in the fall of 2024 should email Harry Kim at areachairsfvharvard@gmail.com.
