Harvard Class of 2015 — Admissions Decisions Sent

On March 30th, Harvard College Admissions e-mailed its decisions to the nearly 35,000 applicants for the Class of 2015. This year's applicant pool again represented the largest number of applicants in history. More than 60% of the admitted students will receive need-based scholarships averaging more than \$40,000, benefiting from a record \$160 million in financial aid.

Southern California had a total of 2,556 applicants - another record high in applicants. Southern California students were accepted into the Class of 2015 for an acceptance rate of 5.4%, which is similar to the acceptance rate last year.

"The Harvard Admissions officers especially appreciate the efforts of Southern California area chairs and interviewers who were heroic," said Marsha Hirano-Nakanishi, Vice Chair of the Schools and Scholarships Committee for the Southern California region. "No other region comes as close to interviewing all applicants as Southern California. And in no other region have interview reports been more important: some high school counselors told Harvard that they were unable to provide school reports for applicants," she said.

Southern California demographics include growing numbers of educated and professional individuals (including increasing numbers of Harvard alumni). At the same time, Southern California remains a powerful magnet for immigrants and

domestic migrants seeking better lives for themselves and their children. The educational challenges in the Greater Los Angeles area underpin the difference between Harvard's overall admit rate of 6.2% and 5.4% for Southern California.

Admitted students and their parents from Southern California were invited to attend receptions in Orange County and Pasadena to meet with alumni and other admitted students. Harvard also hosted a weekend in Cambridge for admitted students to experience life in the Yard. Final decisions for admitted students were due on May 1st.

Strong National Admissions Pool. According to the Harvard Gazette, not only did more students apply this year to Harvard, but the academic strength and diversity of the pool increased as well. By standard measures of academic talent, including test scores and academic performance, this year's applicants presented an unprecedented level of excellence:

- More than 14,000 scored 700 or above on the SAT critical reading test
- 17,000 scored 700 or above on the SAT math test
- 15,000 scored 700 or higher on the SAT writing test
- 3,800 were ranked first in their high school classes

Minority representation remained strong. The admitted class is 17.8% Asian-American, 11.8% African-American, 12.1% Latino, and 1.9% Native American. Slightly more than half (51.5%) of those admitted are male.


