Newport Beach Boat Parade 2024





Q & A from 02138:

Salaidh Angelica Perez '25



Salaidh Angelica Perez '25, a concentrator in Bioengineering on the Mechanical subtract, was born in Gardena, CA, (in the South Bay area) and graduated from North High School in Torrance. She is a proud Dunster House moose and is excited to live in her spacious six-man suite overlooking the beautiful Charles River this upcoming year.

During her time at North, she served as president of her Key Club, completed the 2020 Los Angeles marathon, played singles for her school tennis team, and began what would become six years of taking Korean language courses both at North and Harvard.

Upon arriving in Cambridge in fall 2021, she joined Harvard Yearbook Publications (HYP), the news and blog (Flyby) board of The Crimson, and the Latina Empowerment and Development leadership team. Over the last three years, when not pset-ing at Lamont or spending time with friends, she has tried out the women's rowing team, researched foreign policy under the Harvard Kennedy School's Korea Institute's Public Policy fellowship, and served as HYP's Business Manager.

Currently, she is wrapping up an internship at Bank of America in New York City, serving as a Financial Technology Analyst under the Merrill Lynch Wealth Management division. She has divided her free time between doing reformer pilates, preparing for her senior thesis, awaiting the weekly House of the Dragon episode, and searching for the best iced almond milk latte.

HCSC: What surprised you about being a student at Harvard?

SAP: The most surprising thing was how many opportunities became available to me as a student. Besides the fact that people tend to think I'm smarter than I am (definitely not true), I don't think I would have done things like spend summers interning in NYC or travel internationally as much as I have (I will be going on my fifth trip to Europe later this August!) had I not attended a school with as many resources as Harvard.

HCSC: When was the first time you visited Harvard, and what were your impressions at that time?

SAP: This probably wasn't the best idea, but my first time at Harvard was when I arrived for freshman year move in back in August 2021. In total honesty, I hated Harvard the minute I got off my plane at Boston Logan; I was super homesick and totally unprepared for the culture shock of the East Coast. However, over the semester, with the help of my amazing group of friends and campus support system, I slowly started loving the fall foliage, romanticized walks through the yard and by the Charles, and the memories I was making every day with my friends. I actually missed campus during winter break!

HCSC: What was your funniest moment at Harvard?

SAP: I've definitely had my share of both funny and embarrassing moments on campus, but one of my favorites was River Run freshman year. I remember running around the entire night with my blocking group and finding it hilarious when we ran into a group of guys who were walking around in front of Winthrop with STOP signs that they had somehow managed to find on the ground? I'm really not sure how that happened, but it was really funny to watch.

HCSC: What do you miss most about Southern California (other than the weather, food and family)?

SAP: Honestly, this pretty much covers it! But if I had to choose, I would say downtown Manhattan Beach. I love going to The Kettle with my family and friends and snacking on their garlic french fries, washing it down with an iced latte from Hi-Fi or Verve, and taking a walk by the sand and imagining my future beachfront home. Respectfully, New York's Manhattan can never compare.

HCSC: If you were President of Harvard, what would change?

SAP: Although I had the BEST math TF for my 21b class this past spring, I definitely think the math department could use some restructuring. I think most of the TFs are good teachers, but I think the current pedagogy—that exclusively emphasizes exploratory learning—doesn't take into consideration the backgrounds of many students from low income communities who didn't go to really good public/prep schools and thus have never been exposed to this learning style that is almost exclusive to better-funded institutions. I struggled a lot to adapt to this learning style, and I know a lot of my peers shared these issues, as it makes it easy for us to struggle and fall behind in subjects we could be doing well in if we had simply been exposed to these teaching methods before.



HCSC: How do you think Southern California will figure into your future after Harvard?

SAP: Even though I wanted to go to college out of state, I always knew for a fact that I would eventually settle in So-Cal—ideally Manhattan Beach or Palos Verdes. My goals have changed a bit over the last three years, and one of my immediate goals post-grad now is to work in Germany at an automobile manufacturer like Porsche or Mercedes-Benz for a couple years. Additionally, I also hope to pursue a Masters of Engineering either at Oxford or Cambridge. However, after my series of European adventures, I hope to move back to SoCal and continue my career there, and eventually start up my own local cafe and buy my Manhattan Beach beachfront home.
