Harvard Din & Tonics to Perform in Southern California – January 10

One of the Club's most popular events, the a capella performance of the Harvard Din & Tonics will take place on Saturday, January 10 at the Moss Theatre at New Roads School, Santa Monica.

This will be the group's eighth Wintersession visit to Southern California. The past seven concerts were sold out, and the group has secured a larger venue for this performance. Club members are encouraged to buy their tickets now. All tickets must be purchased in advance.

The Din & Tonics repertoire focuses on jazz standards but also include pop, disco, and folk music. The Dins plan to tour the world this summer. Since they receive no university funding, performances like this one will contribute to funding for their upcoming foreign travels.

The cost is \$30 for members and \$40 for non-members. We invite eligible non-club members to join the Club and purchase a ticket at a low combined price of \$75. Annual Club membership is \$20 for recent graduates and \$55 for regular membership. Tickets and club membership can be

The Dins will be performing in Orange County at an additional concert on January 11. Details for this concert are provided on page 3.



Q & A from 02138:

Mason Hunt '26



Mason Hunt '26, a concentrator in biomedical engineering, graduated from Newport Harbor High School where he was captain of the boys varsity water polo team, the 2021 Southern Section Open Division CIF Champions. He is now a senior in Adams House.

At Harvard, he is busy playing water polo, taking classes in the Science and Engineering Complex, and traveling the Atlantic Seaboard looking for niche surf spots. Holding onto his Southern California roots, Mason founded the Harvard Undergraduate Surf Club which currently has over 100 members and hosts biannual Learn to Surf Events. In his final competitive season, Mason helped lead the Harvard Men's Water Polo team as captain to its second appearance in the NWPC title game in the last three seasons, with a top-20 national ranking. The Crimson lost to No. 14 Princeton in the NWPC Championship game, closing its 2025 campaign with a 20-10 overall record.

HCSC: What surprised you about being a student at Harvard?

MH: What pleasantly surprised me about being a student at Harvard is the remarkable sense of community that transcends the academic environment. Despite the university's broad global impact, the tight-knit communities within different houses and student organizations create a supportive and inclusive atmosphere. This communal spirit has helped me foster meaningful connections, making the vast and renowned institution feel incredibly personal and interconnected.

HCSC: When was the first time you visited Harvard, and what were your impressions at that time?

MH: I first came to Harvard on an official visit for the Water Polo team in April of 2022. I was instantly amazed by the sheer amount of history embedded in Harvard's campus and culture. The day I was leaving, my current teammate and I sat down on a bench outside of Adams House and turned around to see an inscription that read "Franklin Delano Roosevelt 32nd President of The United States lived here in Westmorly Court." My mind was blown.

HCSC: What were your favorite classes or professors?

MH: My favorite class is Startups: From Idea to Exit taught by Spencer Rascoff '97. Rascoff, also a Southern California native, has been one of the most inspiring and influential professors in my time at Harvard. Beyond detailing his vast entrepreneurship experiences in founding Hotwire, Zillow, and now as CEO of Match Group, Professor Rascoff invites incredible guests to class each week to distill their wisdom from the trials and tribulations of entrepreneurship.

HCSC: What was your funniest moment at Harvard?

MH: One morning, I was walking down Mass Ave after a breakfast at Annenberg, and I saw a huge crowd congregating on the street. With snares of the Harvard Band echoing through the piercing February air, I walked deeper into the crowd to assess the cause of the commotion. Out of nowhere, Jennifer Coolidge comes gliding down the street in a bright pink fuzzy hat atop a parade float. She had just won Hasty Pudding Woman of the Year.

HCSC: If you were President of Harvard, what would you change?

MH: If I was president of Harvard, I would relocate the university to Southern California! Harvard is the most magical learning environment in the world and Southern California is the most magical place in the world, so it's a perfect fit. Imagine a Harvard Yard with palm trees and a Charles River with warm summer sand...unbeatable.

HCSC: What do you miss most about Southern California (other than the weather, food and family)?

MH: One element of Southern California that I miss most is the beach. Back home, the beach was where I went to alleviate my stress with soothing, warm sand and a comforting, cool ocean breeze. As founder of the Harvard Undergraduate Surf Club, I have made every effort to enjoy a Massachusetts beaches, but they aren't quite the same. Plus, any Northeast beach after November 1st is more like a frozen tundra. Despite the blistering cold waters and snow-covered sand, I still adventure to the coast in the depths of winter to catch some waves, a small reminder of home.



HCSC: How do you think Southern California will figure into your future after Harvard?

MH: Southern California will play an integral role in my future after Harvard. The relaxed atmosphere, the unchanging 75 degree and sunny climate, and the vibrant beach culture are impossible to beat. After a brief stint in New York City after graduation, I plan for a quick return to Southern California.
