Din & Tonics and Harvard Kroks to Perform in January

One of our most popular events, the A Cappella Double Feature, will be returning to Los Angeles in January. The Harvard Club of Southern California is proud to present two of Harvard's most prestigious a cappella groups, The Harvard Din & Tonics and the Harvard Krokodiloes, as they perform at the Westwood Presbyterian Church on Saturday, January 6 at 8PM.

This will be the groups' sixth Wintersession visit to the Southland. The past five concerts were completely sold out, with people turned away at the door, so we encourage you to buy your tickets now. All tickets MUST be purchased in advance.

The cost is \$25 for members, \$35 for non-members. If you are not a member of the Club, this is an excellent opportunity to join us. Annual membership is just \$25 for recent graduates, and as low as \$45 a year for everyone else (with purchase of a three-year membership), so if you buy four tickets, you're nearly getting your membership for free. Fandango Obon: Tracing the Original Indigenous Path of the Los Angeles River (October 21, 2023)

To honor Indigenous People's Month, a trio of three procession walks on Tongva land, led by community leaders and culture bearers, reclaimed historic courses of the Los Angeles River and converged at the LA State Historic Park on a hot Saturday morning. One route began in Placita Olvera, another at the Downey Recreation Park. The third route started at the Japanese American National Museum (JANM) located in Little Tokyo, a site where during World War II persons of Japanese descent were transported to stables at the Santa Anita Racetrack and, shortly thereafter, newly-arriving African Americans facing racial housing convenants built the World War II Bronzeville community. The Finale Club in Little Tokyo featured Charlie Parker and a young Mile Davis, and their gig was central to an award- winning short story by Rubén Funkahuatl Guevara, whose childhood in Boyle Heights (across the bridge from Little Tokyo) was the inspiration, followed by a musical play in partnership with Chinese American Dan Kwong.

The JANM route headed up First Street, turned onto Spring St., went up Grand Park to the Metro station for a breather, then onto Hill St. and over the freeway and down into Chinatown, stopping again at the Metro station. Who knew that the original Los Angeles River, alluvial and meandering and flowing was the lifeblood of a community? Latinx, Asian American, and African American musicians and singers led the way as we walked and sang a call-and-response song about rivers, ourselves, flowing and going and being strong amidst mobile sculptures of fish and foxes and a blue banner representing the river – all made and carried by MOCA Teens and MOCA staff. Fulcrum, MOCA, and JANM staff dragged cartons of water, snacks, apples, and tangerines, as well as the sound system that augmented the lead singers. After resting, each group proceeded into the Park to a spot where we all circled around an indigenous performance of water and sound and learned an obon odori dance to River song and met the artists Debra Scacco and Joel Garcia who initiated the River Procession performances and gathering. Oh, what a beautiful morning!

Q & A from 02138: Alexandru Bucur '24



Alexandru Bucur, '24, a concentrator in Economics, was born in Pasadena, California and graduated from Harvard-Westlake High School in 2019. He was a co-captain of the men's water polo team during his senior year and helped lead the program to a Division 1 CIF Championship. Outside of water polo and school, he earned his Eagle Scout while serving a number of leadership roles within his troop. He resides in Mather House and has continued his water polo career as both a player for the men's team and a color commentator during the women's season. He recently started to spend his free time surfing and had his first surfing excursion on the East Coast which was an "absolute blast." He spent this past summer pursuing his sports commentary passion by working for World Aquatics and GameOnLive Studios, providing social media coverage, stream production, and commentary for several water polo events throughout the summer.

HCSC: What was your favorite class and why?

AB: Because it is impossible to pick just one class, my two most memorable classes have been The Economics of Cities with Professor Glaeser and Big Data with Professor Chetty. In both of these classes, I got to explore the real world application of economics within the lens of Los Angeles. For The Economics of Cities, I learned how the numerous areas of business shaped the very spread out nature of the city I grew up in. Professor Chetty's course expanded on this idea by teaching me how to analyze the data to better understand the socioeconomic divides within neighborhoods and how they've developed over time. Because of these two classes, I have an increased understanding and appreciation for where I grew up and where I hope to start my life after college.

HCSC: When was the first time you visited Harvard, and what were your impressions?

AB: and in total awe of the history of this campus and Boston as a whole. During that year, I was taking U.S. history and seeing campus made me fully realize how connected Harvard was to numerous aspects of this country's history. This was only furthered after I got the opportunity to speak with faculty members and hear their own experiences before they came back to campus.

HCSC: What has been your funniest moment at Harvard?

AB: I was walking back to my dorm after practice, during the first week of freshman year when I was stopped by a South African rower who lived across from me in the yard. He asked me if I wanted to go watch a live performance of Mama Mia, starring one of his teammates, and have an absolute blast. The next night, I randomly run into him walking towards the T with his teammates and they ask me if I want to go watch The Joker with them. From that point, they've become some of my closest friends and in the most unexpected way that we still laugh about to this day when reminiscing on the carefree days of freshman year.

HCSC: What do you miss most about Southern California?

AB: The thing I miss most from home is the proximity to the beach and mountains that offer a break from everyday life and allow me to connect with the outdoor world. I enjoy spending my free time hiking or surfing and those have become relatively difficult to pursue in Continued from page 6

Cambridge. Luckily, I've been able to take advantage of some opportunities to follow those passions here, but nothing compares to how prevalent or numerous they are in Southern California.

HCSC: How do you think Southern California will figure into your future after Harvard?
