Harvard-Yale Football Telecast Nets Win, Ivy Championship

In what has become a familiar sight over the last decade, Southern California Harvard fans watching the Harvard-Yale football game telecast were treated to another victory, as the Crimson defeated the Bulldogs 45-7 to win the 128th edition of The Game and close out another Ivy League championship season.

The victory by Harvard marked their fifth win in a row over rival Yale, and their 10th win in the last 11 years, as the nation's third-longest football rivalry has taken a decidedly Crimson turn in the new millennium.

Over 120 returning and new Harvard and Yale supporters filled the Yankee Doodles venue in Santa Monica and donned their school colors, as the Bulldogs took an early 7-0 lead only to be outscored by Harvard 45-0 for the remainder of the game. As is quickly becoming a Club tradition, former Harvard band member Dr. Richard Allen Williams '57 was on hand to lead the Crimson faithful in spirited trumpeted renditions of "10,000 Men of Harvard" and "Fair Harvard" after Harvard's scoring plays.

Final score aside, a cordial atmosphere (with Harvard and Yale supporters mixed in together) was the order of the day, complete with a half-time raffle of football memorabilia and free commemorative T-shirts for all Crimson attendees.

Harvard Men's Basketball vs. Loyola Marymount

On November 19th, approximately 500 local Harvard fans came out to cheer on the Harvard Men's basketball team as they made their first visit to Southern California in more than 20 years. The Crimson men's basketball team went on a 25-5 run from late in the first half to early on in the second and downed Loyola Marymount. In the game Harvard won handily, 77-67, having led by as many as 18 points during the 2nd half. The victory improved Harvard's record to 3-0 on the season. The following week the Crimson upset No. 20 Florida State in tournament play.

Sam Maloof was one of the premier woodworkers of the mid-late-20th century and early 21st century, whose rocking chairs graced the White House of Presidents Jimmy Carter, Ronald Reagan, and Bill Clinton, and who was awarded a MacArthur Genius Grant in 1985. Our private tour of "The House That Sam Built" exhibit in the Boone Gallery will provide a view of 35 pieces of Sam Maloof furniture, on loan from private individuals and institutions, set among over 80 pieces of art produced by the Claremont centered, Pomona Valley community of artists and crafts persons from 1945 to 1985. Artists represented include painters Millard Sheets and Paul Darrow, ceramicists Betty Davenport Ford and Otto and Gertrud Natzler, sculptors Aldo Casanova and John Svenson, enamelists Arthur and Jean Goodwin Ames, woodturner Bob Stocksdale, and weaver Kay Sekimachi,

After our before-public-hours tour of the Maloof exhibit, we can explore the Chinese Garden, visit the Library with its Guttenberg Bible, see Pinkie and Blue Boy in the recently renovated Huntington mansion, visit the exhibit "Water Began It All" in the Botanical Center, and learn about the early development of water at the San Gabriel Mission.
