Patric M. Verrone is an Emmy award-winning television writer and producer. As President of the Writers Guild of America, West, he led the union of 10,000 writers through a successful 100-day strike, securing Internet revenue and creative rights in new media. He was named among Time Magazine's "Most Influential People of 2008." A graduate of Boston College Law School, he has taught at Loyola Law School and UCLA Extension, and received the 2006 Association of Media & Entertainment Counsel Labor Counsel of the Year Award.

Verrone co-founded the Harvard Club of Southwest Florida and is an active member of both the HCSC and Harvardwood. "Between student interviews, career advisory and mentor programs, reunion functions, and frequent campus visits just to buy stuff at the Coop," says Verrone, "I already feel deeply entwined in the fabric of the Harvard alumni world. Serving as a director of the HAA would only encourage me further."

The Sumner M. Redstone Foundation recently announced charitable grants of more than \$105 million to fund research and patient care advancements at FasterCures/The Center for Accelerating Medical Solutions, the Cedars-Sinai Prostate Cancer Center, Massachusetts General Hospital, and the Cambodian Children's Fund.
