## **Harvard Announces Large Endowment Losses**

Harvard President Drew Faust said that Harvard expects to record a 30% reduction in its endowment value for the current fiscal year which ends June 30, according to a February 18 letter to the Harvard community.

"We remain in the midst of an economic slowdown unlike any in decades," she wrote.

The Harvard endowment was \$36.9 billion last June 30. \$1.4 billion from the endowment is being distributed for the University's operating expenses this fiscal year.

Harvard has announced the following actions to deal with its new fiscal realities:

- The Faculty of Arts and Sciences (FAS) will reduce department budgets by 15% in the next fiscal year which begins on July 1.
- Salaries for faculty and non-union workers will be held flat in the next academic year.

### **Endowment Losses** (continued from page 1)

- A voluntary early retirement program has been launched, for which some 1,600 faculty members are eligible.
- The pace and scale of the Allston physical expansion will be reconsidered.
- Construction of the 1 million square foot, \$1 billion Allston Science Complex will be slowed.

Harvard's financial aid policies will not be changed, including Harvard College's low-income and middle-income financial aid initiatives. Needbased scholarship aid is expected to grow to a record \$147 million, an 18% increase over what was planned for the current academic year.

Undergraduate tuition, room and board charges for 2009-10 will increase by 3.5% over the current year's costs - the same increase as last year - to \$48,868.



# Harvard Club of Southern California to Honor Award Recipients at Annual Dinner — May 31, 2009



# John Harvard Award Recipient: Father Gregory Boyle Executive Director of Homeboy Industries

Father Gregory Boyle, the Executive Director of Homeboy Industries, will be this year's recipient of the Club's John Harvard Award for Distinguished Community Service.

Father Boyle, best known as Father Greg, is a native of Los Angeles and a graduate of Loyola High School. One of eight siblings, he was ordained as a Jesuit priest in 1984. In 1992 he initiated a program called "Jobs for the Future" to address the needs of gang-involved youth. This has become a nationally recognized program called "Homeboy Industries," which is now a collection of five businesses that include a bakery, silkscreen business, café, landscaping service, and a retail store with yearly sales of \$2.5 million. For his comprehensive and effective approach to addressing gang violence and improving the lives of thousands of disadvantaged youth, Father Gregory Boyle was the recipient of a 2008 James Irvine Foundation Leadership Award.



### Excellence in Education Award Recipient: Chris Steinhauser, Superintendent, Long Beach Unified School District

Chris Steinhauser, the Long Beach Unified School District Superintendent, will be the recipient of the Club's Excellence in Education Award.

As Superintendent of the third largest school district in California, Mr. Steinhauser has earned many prestigious awards for the District including the 2003-2004 Broad Prize, which honors large urban school districts for overall performance and improvement in student success while reducing the achievement gap for poor and minority students. He is a product of the Long Beach Unified School District, which he attended continuously from Kindergarten until his graduation from Wilson High. Steinhauser attended Long Beach City College and California State University, Long Beach. He began as an elementary school teacher at Burnett Elementary School, was promoted to Principal at Signal Hill Elementary School, which became known as "the miracle on Walnut Avenue." Under his leadership that spans 26 years in education, Long Beach students in all racial and ethnic groups have made unprecedented gains on rigorous state tests.

The Club awards The Harvard Book, a collection of insightful essays penned by distinguished Harvard alumni over the centuries, to outstanding high school students in their junior year. The Harvard Book is presented to high school juniors who "display excellence in scholarship and high character, combined with achievement in other fields." 
