Harvard Celebrates 375th Anniversary with Rain & Revelry

Harvard celebrated its 375th anniversary with a festive evening of revelry and musical and dance performances, despite torrential rain, deep mud, and lightning in Tercentenary Theatre in Harvard Yard on October 14 in Cambridge.

High-tech displays, including colorful rows of LED lights on Widener Library's steps and Sever Hall's arched doorways, contributed to the party atmosphere that attracted a crowd of 15,000 - 18,000 attendees. Undergraduates marched into Tercentenary Theater in themed parades organized by the Houses.

The undergraduate-focused celebration began with special dinners in the Harvard College dining halls, featuring dishes drawn from four centuries of Harvard cuisine. Joanne Chang AB '91, owner of Flour Bakery in Boston, created a massive, H-shaped red velvet birthday cake that was served at the celebration.

Alumni who attended the Harvard Alumni Association's fall meeting were treated to a gala reception at the Charles Hotel in Cambridge prior to donning rain ponchos over their evening attire.


